### 4. **Discussion on Brenham Police Department's 100-year Anniversary Celebration**

Bob Cox announced that Washington County Cares is hosting a fundraiser with the proceeds going to the police department for the 100-year celebration. The fundraiser will be held May 1<sup>st</sup>. Planning and coordination are still in the works. Chief spoke about the department's upcoming 100-year anniversary celebration; challenge coins and anniversary badges for the officers have been ordered.

### 5. **Discussion and Presentation on the Brenham Police Department's Statistics for November and December 2025**

Chief presented the November and December patrol and performance statistics for the Brenham Police Department.

### 6. **Discussion and Presentation on the Brenham Police Department on 2025 Annual Report**

Chief presented a rough draft of the BPD 2025 annual report.

### 7. **Administrative Updates**

Council has approved BPD to apply for 2 grants through the Governor's Office Public Safety Offices Program. The Community Engagement Officer (CEO) position has been revamped from the previous position of Community Resource Officer (CRO). This position will be the main contact for the community. Corporal Susan Gibbs will be filling the position. Gibbs is currently a School Resource Officer, so it has yet to be determined when she will step into that role. The department is sending 3 cadets to the TEEX Police Academy in College Station. They are due to graduate in June. Chief stated that the Drone & First Responder Program (DFR) was taken before Council and was approved. The company has offered to provide the drone for 1 year so it can be tested by BPD.

It was announced the next CAB meeting will take place on April 14, 2026.
