5. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Funding Requests from the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) for Various Parks and Recreation Projects

Director Dane Rau took this item. Each year, the Parks and Recreation Staff presents and recommends projects to both the Parks Board and the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) for input and potential funding respectively. These funds are derived from local sales tax proceeds and are used to enhance parks, recreation, and aquatic amenities throughout the community.

Our goal is to strike a balance between new, innovative additions and the ongoing maintenance and revitalization of existing infrastructure. We also align our project recommendations with the adopted Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Master Plan to the greatest extent possible.

For FY25-26, due to a reduction in overall sales tax revenues and the reallocation split with 401(B) Sales Tax, available funding has decreased from a typical \$1.2 million to approximately \$900,000.

FY25-26 Project Funding Options - We are presenting two funding scenarios for consideration:

Option 1 – Allocate \$500,000 to Brenham Family Park

This option prioritizes funding toward Brenham Family Park (BFP) to move the project toward construction by late 2025 or early 2026. With this option, the remaining \$400,000 is allocated across a limited number of high-priority parks and aquatic projects.

- **Brenham Family Park** – \$500,000
- **Parks Projects:**
 - Fink/Korthaurer Field Light Upgrades – \$275,000
 - Master Turf Infield Rehabilitation – \$35,000
- **Aquatics Projects:**
 - Leisure Pool Float Rehabilitation – \$40,000
 - Slide Tower Repairs – \$27,000
 - Parking Lot Light Replacement – \$29,000
- **Total: \$906,000**

This option continues the city's momentum toward the development of BFP, which is currently funded with \$1 million from BCDC and \$750,000 from a Texas Parks & Wildlife (TP&W) grant. Phase 1 construction is estimated at \$2.6 million, meaning we still need to secure approximately \$350,000 to meet minimum grant match requirements.

Option 2 – No Allocation to Brenham Family Park

This alternative redirects all available funds to existing parks and aquatic facilities, resulting in a broader reach of improvements across the system but delaying progress on BFP.

- **Parks Projects: 4 projects funded**
 - Fink/Korthaurer Field Light Upgrades – \$275,000
 - Master Turf Infield Rehabilitation – \$35,000
 - Fireman's Re-Level and Sod (Infield and Outfield) - \$295,000
 - Fireman's Park Playground Replacement- \$120,000
- **Aquatics Projects: 5 projects funded**
 - Leisure Pool Float Rehabilitation – \$40,000
 - Slide Tower Repairs – \$27,000
 - Parking Lot Light Replacement – \$29,000
 - BBAC Concession Stand Refurbishment- \$50,000
 - BBAC Banana Split Slide Refurbishment- \$20,000
- **No funding allocated to Brenham Family Park**

While this option allows us to address more immediate needs, it risks delaying or jeopardizing BFP's Phase 1 development timeline and grant requirements due to the current funding gap.

Recommendation

Given the funding challenges and the importance of initiating construction of Brenham Family Park to leverage existing grant dollars, staff recommends Option 1. While it limits the number of other projects we can pursue in FY25-26, it strategically invests in a major community asset with long-term impact.

It was motioned by Delbert Boeker move forward with Option 1 as a recommendation with a second by Harvey McIntyre.

Subject: Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Master Plan Update

Date: August 1, 2025

It has come time to update the City of Brenham Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Master Plan. The current Master Plan was developed in 2015 and requires an update in 2025/26. The purpose of the Master Plan is to provide guidelines for future development of the City's Park and Recreation System. Per-Industry standards, master plans should be reviewed and updated every 5-10 years.

The Parks and Recreation team has been working with Jamie Rae Walker with Texas A&M AgriLife Extension and her team to gather information, conduct community Pop Ups, send and receive community surveys and compile a final report. This process started in 2020 and with several delays we have finally received the analytical information that will be needed for the Parks Master Plan. This was a big piece of the Parks Master Plan and now we will focus on updating the plan.

In the upcoming months we will look at selecting a consulting firm to work with us to update the rest of the plan which will take us to 2035. As you know, a lot of aspects have changed since 2015, and a lot of projects have been completed so the plan will be revised to show progress. As growth continues in Brenham, we will also work to implement some new ideas to keep our parks and open spaces vibrant and always moving in a positive direction as it is related to development, new open spaces and securing funding. Our goal is to get this done and a plan in place by end of 2026.

Per the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Master Plan guidelines, updates should include a summary of accomplishments, new public input, most recent inventory data, updated needs assessment, priorities, new implementation plan, demographics, population projections, goals and objectives, standards, and maps. Priorities should be updated as high priority items are accomplished, and lower priorities move up.

We want to give the board an update and as things progress, we will ask for your input and bring draft versions in front of you ultimately asking for final approval for recommendation to City Council.
