Subject: Discussion and Update on Brenham Family Park Construction Progress and Timeline

Date: August 3, 2026

The Brenham Family Park Construction is progressing nicely during the summer months. City staff, Quiddity Engineering, and MBC Management is hosting monthly construction meetings. There has also been several site visits throughout the last few months.

The detention/retention pond was completed last week. The clay liner was installed and is now ready for the aeration bubbler. Once that is installed certain small items will be installed around the edge of the pond such as tie ins for the incoming drainage as well as the rock 4-bay which protects from erosion during rainfall events. I have included construction pictures of the pond as of end of July.

MBC Management will focus on the installation of the 1-mile trail which includes brush clearing taking place in the upcoming weeks. This is necessary to open the pathway for the 10' concrete trail. They are only clearing what needs to be cleared regarding brush. (See trail clearing pictures)

The parking lot pad is completed and has been compacted to design standards and will be ready for future concrete pours. Other items happening soon will be the 16' maintenance drive as well as the concrete cul d sac that will allow park users to get closer to the pond for loading and unloading.

The construction is going well and is still scheduled to be completed in mid-November. Utilities, lighting, restroom installation, and other items will soon follow.

Stephanie Doland, City of Brenham Development Services Manager, will be at the meeting sharing updates as it relates to development around the park.

Subject: Discussion and Update on New Henderson Basketball Court Pavillion

Date: August 3, 2026

The Henderson Park Basketball Court Pavillion Project is going well. Darren Heine with BBA Architects has been working with City Staff and the Betts Family to add a basketball structure over the dual courts at Henderosn Park. This will be the first covered basketball court in the Brenham Parks System.

Below you will see a rendering of what the proposed structure will look like. It will be a Quonset structure that will add to the park's beauty and provide shade and a dry place to play basketball for our park users.

The project is set to bid on August 18th. Once bids are fully evaluated, we plan to present them to City Council in early September.

We are thrilled to work with the Betts Family and BBA Architects to see this project come to life. It will be a great attribute to Henderson Park.

Subject: Discussion and Update on Brenham Family Park Donation Amenities (Playscape, Pavillion, and Fishing Pier/Boardwalk)

Date: August 3, 2026

As the Brenham Family Park Construction progresses, we would like to share with you all three other projects that we are working on within the 32 acres of the Brenham Family Park. I am thrilled to let you know that several families have approached the City since the groundbreaking showing interest in adding amenities that were not covered by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Grant or were left out of the design of the initial phase of the park.

Playscape

As you have heard we will be adding a large playscape near the entrance of the park which will be like no other playscape we have in Brenham Parks. This playscape will have many attributes that will entertain all age groups and challenge each visitor to the park with unique opportunities. It will also be diversified in which it will have amenities for children with disabilities such as motor skills, sensory, children having to utilize motor devices and children with autism and ADHD. This is something no other playground in Brenham Parks accounts for and now we have the opportunity with this project.

We have the playscape under design and will soon receive 3D renderings that we can share at the next meeting. We will also be completing a bid package and will have those dates at the next meeting in hopes of bidding out this project by the end of the year or sooner. M2L Landscape Architects will be designing this project, as they were also the lead landscape architects on phase one of the Brenham Family Park.

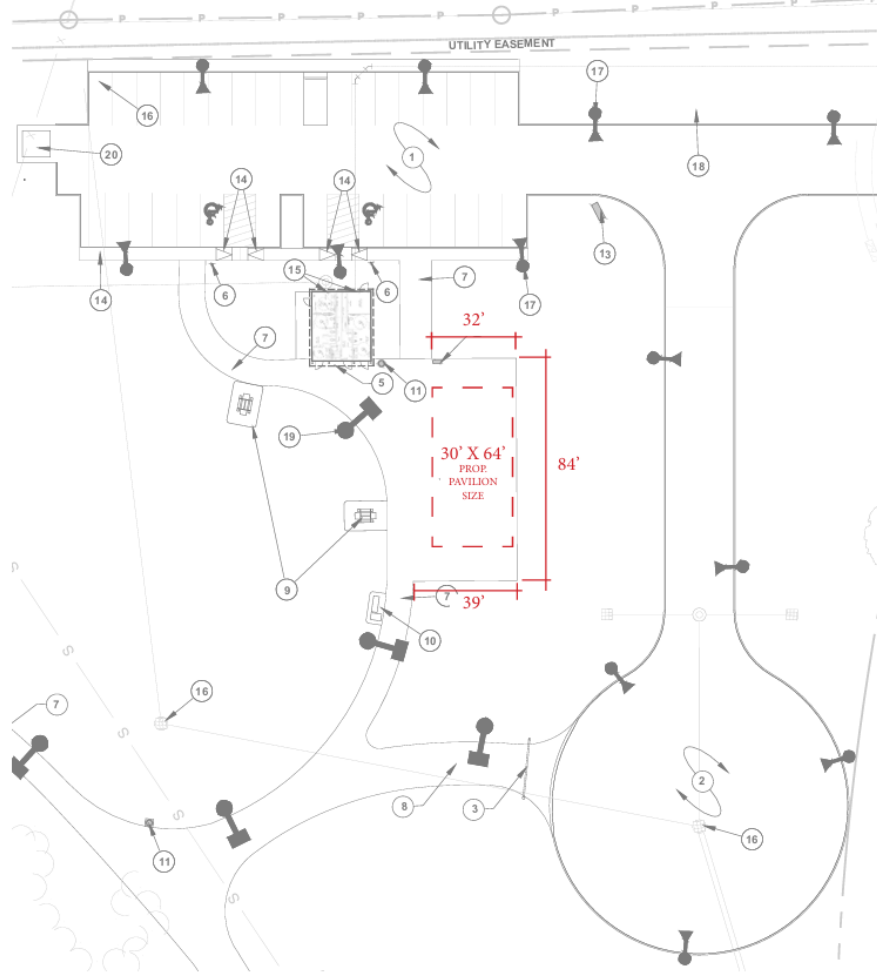

Pavillion Structure

The 2nd project we are working on with a donor will be a covered pavilion over the new seating area that was planned for the initial phase of the Brenham Family Park. We only were able to include the concrete pad in phase 1 but now we will be able to add a pavilion so park patrons can have shade while visiting the park and eating.

This project has just gotten underway, and we are currently receiving renderings and an opinion of probable costs from M2L Architects. We expect this project to be bid with the playscape in which we will have one bid and one contractor perform the work.

Fishing Pier/Boardwalk/Kayak Launch

The 3rd project that just came to us in the last two weeks was the opportunity to add a fishing pier and/or boardwalk to the pond structure. We are working with another local family who has deep roots to the Brenham area and want to offer an amenity to the Brenham Family Park that families and kids can enjoy that was not in the initial phase. We have shared this with M2L Architects along with some ideas that we have seen in other parks that we can focus on. This project will also be added to the scope of work pertaining to the playscape and pavilion in order to have one bid and one contractor.

We expect all 3 of these projects to be bid out by the end of 2026 and hopefully be implemented in early 2027. We are so grateful to all three families who thought about the future of Brenham and its Parks System. We will work hard to meet their needs, all while opening a new park.

Subject: Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Master Plan Update

Date: July 22, 2026

The City's current Parks and Recreation Master Plan was adopted in 2015 and is due for an update as part of the recommended 5–10-year review cycle established by industry best practices. The purpose of the Master Plan is to provide a long-term vision and strategic framework for the development, maintenance, and enhancement of Brenham's parks, recreation facilities, open spaces, and programs while ensuring they meet the current and future needs of the community.

In 2020, the Parks and Recreation Department partnered with Jamie Rae Walker and the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service to begin the public engagement process. Through community pop-up events, stakeholder outreach, and resident surveys, valuable public input was collected to help identify community priorities. Although the project experienced several delays, staff has now received the final analytical report, providing the critical data needed to move forward with updating the Master Plan.

To assist with the update, the City has contracted with Dr. JoAnn Zimmermann, who is working closely with staff to develop a comprehensive plan that will guide the future of Brenham's parks and recreation system.

Current efforts are focused on refining the Master Plan's goals and objectives while evaluating several key planning initiatives, including:

- Provide a safe and comprehensive system of recreational trails looking at connectivity and park linkage system.
- Provide quality community programs and services that will accommodate the current and future needs of the residents of Brenham
- Preservation and improvement of the natural environment and heritage resources that represent Brenham's identity and uniqueness
- Develop, train and support a professional Parks and Recreation Department that effectively serves the community

- Develop an adequate level of funding to achieve the vision and goals of this master plan
- Marketing of the city's parks, trails, and open space system to educate our residents and attract visitors to the community through the provision of recreation opportunities that are unique to Brenham and the surrounding environment
- Ensure that new development contributes to a sustainable, equitable, and connected parks system through an effective Parkland Dedication program that meets the recreational needs of a growing community
- Establish standard operating procedures, policies, and ordinances that align with industry best practices and promote responsible park development, long-term financial sustainability, and conservation efforts that reflect community needs and growth.

These efforts will ensure the updated Master Plan reflects current best practices while positioning the city to meet future community needs and remain competitive for grant funding opportunities.

Staff meets monthly with Dr. Zimmermann to review progress, discuss recommendations, and refine the document. The goal is to complete the updated Parks and Recreation Master Plan by the end of the year.

Stay tuned for additional updates as this important planning effort continues.

WORK SESSION

1. Discussion and Update on Brenham Family Park Construction Progress and Timeline

Dane Rau provided an update on our the Brenham Family Park Construction Progress and Timeline. As many of you know, the groundbreaking was held on May 12, 2026, to kick-off construction. MBC Management of Navasota is the general contractor and is working with Quiddity Engineers to construct the park as designed. The following timeline is what will be expected throughout the construction process....

During this time staff and Quiddity Engineers will be holding monthly progress meetings with MBC Management as it relates to construction of the park and addressing any items that come up. We are so excited to have this park under construction and ready for the opening to the public later this year.

2. Discussion and Update on New Henderson Basketball Court Pavillion

Dane Rau provided an update on New Henderson Basketball Court Pavillion. We would like to share something with the Parks Board that is very special and will add to our

park's amenities. We have received a donation from the Betts Family in honor of Bill Betts to construct a cover over the basketball courts at Henderson Park. This has been on our list of projects for some time, but we have had other higher priorities, so it has gotten pushed back. We learned in January that the Betts Family would like to fund the project and make this a reality for our parks and the many users of Henderson Park.

We have entered into a design agreement with BBA Architects to design and bid the project. Attached you will see the draft concept of the basketball pavilion that we are moving forward with. This will be a great attribute that will provide the only covered basketball court in Brenham Parks, will add to our Henderson Park landscape and be built for long-term needs.

We anticipate the process to take 6-8 months and are hopeful that bids will come back positive. If all goes well we anticipate construction to start in the Fall/Winter of 2026.

We are so thankful for the donation to add an amenity to this magnitude in our parks system.



3. Discussion and Update on Brenham Family Park Inclusive Playscape

Dane Rau provided an update on Brenham Family Park Inclusive Playscape. We wanted to share with the Parks Board another partnership between the Betts Family and the City of Brenham. Knowing that Phase 1 of the Brenham Family Park didn't have an inclusive playscape area due to overall park costs, the Betts Family wanted to honor their dad William Harvey "Bill" Betts Jr by funding an inclusive play-for-all playscape that will add to the park. We are so grateful to work with the family along with M2L Associates to design a large play area for inclusive play. This means we will now have

a playscape area for kids with disabilities and kids of all ages in one area. This playscape will be much different than any other playground or play area that we currently have. It will include natural and artificial play areas using the topography of the land as well as many features that challenge kids of all ages and disabilities.

We are currently working on the design with M2L Associates and will be bringing back the final design once it is agreed on. I have included examples of different inclusive playscapes to give the board an idea of what we are shooting for.

This will be a huge addition, and we are so grateful for the partnership opportunity. our 2025–26 funded projects, specifically regarding project timelines and associated costs.

In the table below, you will see the progress we have made in moving these projects forward, along with the expenditure tied to each one. With your continued support, along with the partnership of BCDC, this funding allows us to stay proactive with maintenance throughout our Parks System and at the Aquatic Center.

We take great pride in maintaining our parks and facilities and are committed to keeping them in excellent condition for our community to enjoy.

7. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon a Recommendation to Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) for Parks and Recreation Projects for FY 26-27

Staff presented proposed projects and cost for Parks, Aquatics & Recreation. Each year, the Parks and Recreation Staff presents and recommends projects to both the Parks Board and the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) for input and potential funding respectively. These funds are derived from local sales tax proceeds and are used to enhance parks, recreation, and aquatic amenities throughout the community.

Our goal is to strike a balance between new, innovative additions and the ongoing maintenance and revitalization of existing infrastructure. We also align our project recommendations with the adopted Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Master Plan to the greatest extent possible.

For FY26-27, due to a reduction in overall sales tax revenues and the reallocation split with 401(B) Sales Tax, available funding has decreased from a typical \$1.2 million to approximately \$925,000.

Recreation programs continue monthly with good attendance and partnerships with community groups (business and organizations).
