4. Introduction of Newly Appointed CAB Members

New Citizen Advisory Board Members, Bridgit Williams and Davis Romo, were introduced by Interim Chief Powell.

5. Discussion and Update on Police Staffing/Training

The department was fully staffed for two weeks. Two noncommissioned individuals have started at the Bryan Academy. One spot has also been approved for the TEEX Academy. The department should be fully staffed by October. Powell explained that is extremely difficult to compete with the larger cities such as Houston, Austin, College Sation, etc. to find good candidates. We want homegrown, local candidates; want to focus on people who live in Brenham; want to recruit from the individuals raised here.

6. Discussion of Current Events

There has been a plethora of stolen vehicles, mainly Hyundai's and Kia's-a lot is based upon the TikTok video challenge. There was an officer who saw a stolen vehicle; a chase ensued, which led to both vehicles crashing, then a foot chase. The suspect was eventually caught. One way of stealing vehicles is using phone chargers to get into the steering column to jump start the car.

Everyone was also warned not to leave anything of value in their cars unattended – firearms, computer, purse, phone, etc.

7. Discussion of Interim Chief Powell's Assignment

Powell explained that Interim Chief is a step above Acting Chief. As of right now, Leadership is not looking for a Police Chief. He is not looking to change anything right now; the only thing that he does want to change is the department mission statement. Would like it to mean something yet be short; one sentence. This is the first time in over fifty years a chief from internal will be running the department.

Staff liaison Christi Korth announced the next CAB meeting will take place June 11, 2024.
