#### 4. Discussion of the Fortnightly Club Donation

Librarian Tammy Murphy read Fortnightly's City Council letter presenting a donation of \$37,000 to the Nancy Carol Roberts Memorial Library. Appreciation from the library was expressed to present Fortnightly members. A discussion among the board members covered the use of funds for the program room upgrades, circulation items, audio books, summer reading program, and research materials. The balance will be deposited in the Library Donation Fund.

# 5. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon the Addition of Hoopla Digital Content Platform and Swank Streaming Service

Librarian Tammy Murphy presented information on Hoopla Digital Services. Hoopla and the State Agency Partners Library Action Network (PLAN) have invited the NCRML to join a consortium of libraries to share an online library of eBooks and audio books for our patrons purchased from Hoopla. The board discussed their experiences with other library's Hoopla accounts and experiences have been positive. A motion was made by Lu Hollander and seconded by Jan Klingsporn to approve joining the PLAN consortium in purchasing resources from the Hoopla Digital Content Platform. The motion passed with the Board voting as follows:

Subject: Presentation and Recapping of 2025 Summer Reading Program




2025 Color Our World Summer Reading Program clearly colored the entire world of the Nancy Carol Roberts Memorial Library for seven weeks with a record number of program attendees, challenge participants, prizes, parties, and pizza. The statistics show the community enjoys the enrichment of summer programming for children, teens, and adults.

The statistics available for 2023, 2024, and 2025 are included in the packet. 737 people registered on Beanstack to log reading minutes with a great increase of 325,839 minutes read this summer. There are no verifiable statistics on pizza consumed, but, somehow, over 200 people ate 30 pizzas in under 20 minutes.


The performers were well received and praised this summer with several entertainers performing for the library for the first time. Plans are already made to attend the Performer Showcase in Georgetown where staff chooses and books exciting new shows that specialize in school and library performances.


The biggest concern is participation growth, which is a good thing. Program room capacity was reached during several weeks at both shows on Tuesdays, and attendance caps were reached on some of the teen events on Thursdays. Prize amounts are based on the previous year's statistics, therefore additional prizes may have to be ordered in the future if participation continues to grow.










# **Tshirt Prizes 2025**

Advisory Board. These are included on the next page

- Library HVAC issues continue with a compressor needed in the Program Room. The part has been delayed since July 24, 2025.
- Program room upgrades by Avinext are scheduled for Sept 11-12, 2025.
- Fall programming begins Sept 2 with preschool storytime every Monday, after school weekly program every Tuesday, teen programs every Thursday, home school biweekly program on first and third Thursday, and monthly adult programs.
- We are gathering plans for a special 2026. The staff is working on event ideas for Library125 and America250 events. Two very special birthdays are coming up.
- New outreach opportunities are Clear the Shelter on Aug 23 with a library booth, and Brenham Next enrichment classes on various dates in the fall including storytimes, sewing, and craft classes
