Subject: Update on Brenham Family Park
Date: June 26, 2024

The City of Brenham has received positive news from Texas Parks and Wildlife concerning the Brenham Family Park Grant from 2020. After many many studies, reports, environmental assessments and correspondence with both the National Parks Service and Texas Parks and Wildlife we have been told by Texas Parks and Wildlife that they have received the approval to issue a Notice to Proceed to the City of Brenham as it relates to Phase 1 of the Brenham Family Park from the National Parks Service.

We are actively working with Quiddity to finalize the design and meet the grant elements while also getting a better understanding of the overall budget of the development of Phase 1(a). We should receive the notice to proceed within the next 30 days from TP&W and will have from 3-5 yrs. to complete the grant elements that consist of utility improvements, parking, restrooms, walking/bike trail, amenity lake/detention, lighting, wildflower areas, pedestrian bridges and signage.

When we applied for the grant in 2020 the largest grant amount was \$750,000. We will receive that along with additional funds that were previously earmarked for the Brenham Family Park by BCDC which consists of another \$794,000. This currently gives the city \$1.54 million dollars to start on the Brenham Family Park amenities. With inflation and significant price increases over the last 4 years we know it will take additional funds to get this project off the ground and yet meet the grant elements that were submitted. We are currently working with both Quiddity and Texas Parks and Wildlife to make sure we meet the grant elements yet receive a complete project that all of Brenham can be proud of.

This is the closest we have ever been and now the reality of moving forward to open this park up while finding ways to fund the amenities will be a top priority for staff, the City of Brenham, Parks Board and BCDC. We will be having discussion with BCDC, Parks Board and City Council and get their input on the timeline, priorities going into construction, and additional resources needed to fulfill grant elements. We do have sometime, as once the NTP is sent to the City of Brenham we have 3 yrs. to construct the park with a possibility of an additional 2 yr. extension.

We just wanted to share the good news that we have verbally been told by Texas Parks and Wildlife and update Parks Board

Re: Discussion Regarding Re-Organization of a 7x7 and 11x11 Soccer League Utilizing Hohlt Park Fields

Parks Board Members

Staff has been approached about allowing an organization to utilize Hohlt Park Soccer Fields for a 7x7 and a 11x11 soccer leagues. Casey and I met with the Ramos Brothers, and they are looking at organizing a league that possibly will range from 5 yr. olds to adults. This is similar to Quik Foot soccer and would give a large range of soccer enthusiast a place to play competitive soccer.

We would like to discuss with the board this approach and work through some logistics as it relates to length of season, use of fields and rates charged. When we visited with the Ramos Brothers the first thing that they have to secure is insurance for hosting a league and playing at City of Brenham Fields. This is required of all leagues, select teams and tournaments when playing on Brenham fields. Once insurance is provided, we can move forward with other logistics. Their preference is to play on Thursdays and Sundays and utilize up to 3 fields total. They would also like this to be a 10–11-month season. We spoke to them about field usage during the Fall with WCYSA, Flag Football, Blinn Soccer and other entities using the fields and how we need to make sure to not abuse the fields to keep them in good playing shape. They are open for discussion, and we would like to speak with the board on a few items.....

1. Is this something of interest with already having WCYSA? (This would bring adult soccer back and more options).
2. How long of season are we comfortable with?
3. What type of fee schedule do we assign since this is not a local league and the length of season may extend a lot longer?

Casey and I will present this item and be able to work with the board on a preferred direction. We will need your feedback as we want to accommodate more users but need to be careful how we do so.

4. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Funding Requests from the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) for Various Parks and Recreation Projects

Dane Rau started the Discussing. Each year, the staff is able to present and recommend various projects to both Parks Board and BCDC for funding opportunity. These funds are derived from sales tax proceeds that are spent locally and are geared to enhance Parks and Recreation along with Aquatic amenities. We strive to have a mix of new amenities along with maintenance and upkeep of existing amenities which keeps our Parks System looking fresh and vibrant. We also take in account the Parks Master Plan and follow our goals and projects to the best of our ability.

Below you will see the requests that we bring to the Parks Board for consideration. We would like the Parks Board's approval to recommend the below projects funding through BCDC on the June meeting related to 2024-25 funding cycle. There are 13 projects valued at \$1.49 million dollars in this year's requests. Even though these are recommended it is still up to BCDC to comment and approve based on allocated resources in their budget for final funding. The next BCDC Meeting is set for June 27th.

These projects were evaluated by Parks and Recreation Staff and prioritized based on need and future value to our parks system. Due to priority, the budget and status of existing infrastructure these projects are of our utmost importance.

Tammy Jaster went over the Aquatics and Recreation requests and Casey Redmann went over the request for the Parks Department.

Our 3 largest requests will be Jackson St Park Phase 2 Improvements (\$500,000), Brenham Family Park Additional Funding (\$300,000), and a Replacement Slide for the Blue Bell Aquatic

Center Leisure Pool (\$350,000). All items will be shared in farther detail at the meeting on a slide show.

We respectfully ask the Parks Board for a recommendation to BCDC to consider funding these items so that we can move forward with enhancements to our park and recreation facilities.

Board Member Ginger Bosse asked about Phase I at Jackson Street Park. Dane Rau stated that phase I would include ADA, restrooms, lighting, and phase II could include some additional items. Essentials are priority to get things started at that park.

Dane Rau went over the 2024 – 2029 projects slated for each year. Dane also pointed out that when we push projects back, they get expensive and other years become more expensive. It is a lot of expense but there is a lot of maintenance, and some wants. But the staff looks to keep what we have in working condition. Board Member Dusty Robinson asked about pricing for fields and rentals vs. usage and if we need to look at increasing pricing. Dane stated that in January we did update pricing, but we are still on the lower end, but it was increased as of the new year. We can evaluate again before the new year again based on the usage and demand this year.

Board Member Ginger Bosse asked if and when we need to replace the playground at Greenwade Playground, that we consider making a turf field and making that a little t-ball field again. This could then be used for special needs programs, t-ball, kickball, etc. Dane stated that we did leave the dugout pads and awnings as well as home plate so that would be easy to do. And would bring back some history to the park.

Board Member Dusty Robinson asked if the Parks Board could see the bid pack for Jackson Street Park and Pricing when we get to that point. Board Member Ginger Bosse also suggested that we move the Automatic Back Door Handicap Parking to the top of the list for the Aquatic Center needs as there are several people that use that door, and this would be helpful for them.

Subject: Wings to S.O.A.R (Stabilize, Organize, Accelerate Rehabilitation)

Date: July 2, 2024

We have been presented with a possible partnership with Amberly Darby, a licensed PTA for over 20 years specializing in an intensive program for neurological disorders as well as rehabilitation following neurological traumas.

Staff had the opportunity to meet with Amberly about the possible partnership. The partnership would include leasing the use of the facility in order to launch a location in Brenham to bring a unique opportunity to families and the community of a new enhanced Intensive Program. This Program Wings to SOAR is tailored to meet the needs of children and families first. The program will enhance the Thera Suit Method Intensive Program by combining it with aquatic therapy as well as horseback therapy.

Amberly has meet with the Horse Arena and will be utilizing their facility 3 days a week asking to use our multipurpose room 2 days a week along with the pool.

This program is unique to the customer base it reaches. Normally families must seek the Thera Suit Method, Aquatic Therapy, and Equine Therapy in different locations. Amberly is combining her knowledge into one program for the client.

The program focuses on core stabilization as the center, brain mapping to organize motor planning, and accelerate outcomes by reinforcing positive patterns for improving rehabilitation of the body as a whole, to create: SOAR: Stabilize, Organize, Accelerate Rehabilitation.

This is an intensive 3-week program for 2.5 hours a day x 5 days a week x 3 consecutive weeks. During this time, additionally they will utilize the therapy pool for

1 hour 2 days a week for the 3-week program. There would be up to 3 clients each month with a week break monthly.

Amberly is requesting the use of the multipurpose room for the Thera Suit Method, the opportunity to keep the unit tucked in the corner of the room, and use of the pool. Amberly would be at the facility from 830am – 5pm 2 days a week. Pool time would be during open hours and not during peak aerobic or high usage times. Pool time would consist of Amberly and patient so not much room is needed.

Staff is requesting guidance on this possible partnership, pricing, etc. as we have not had a partnership similar to this one in the past.
