

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

February 2014

This is my soap box message to the members. In the four years of working with the CPAAA I have noticed that only a few of the members seem to contribute significant effort to keep the organization functioning and providing support to our police department.

Volunteer organizations are usually operated on a 20/80 participation level. This means that about 20 percent of the members do 80 percent of the work to keep the organization functioning while the other 80 percent provide about 20 percent. In our highly successful operation the ratio is closer to 15/85 participation. There is no reason to expect this ratio to change, but my purpose in this message is to encourage some of you who can, to offer more help to the 15 percent.

I have heard complaints about the people who do the work being a clique, being to bossy, or not delegating work to those who make themselves available. All of these seem to be legitimate complaints until you understand that those who do most of the work have formed a team that works well together and they allow for the idiosyncrasies of the members of that team. Yes, they sometimes may hurt your feelings, but they probably won't be aware of that unless you have the courage to tell them. You do have to be a little thick skinned sometimes, but I can assure you that it is not an intentional slight or comment aimed at hurting you or excluding you.

If you can allow them some slack and keep injecting yourself into the effort to make us successful, you will find that all of these people are warm, hard-working, friendly, bossy, and sometimes unaware they have taken over what you volunteered to do without excusing themselves.

You may note that I have not included myself in that 15 percent. It's because I am lazy and I don't mind that they want to do all the work, but I keep sticking myself into their business and they let me help a little. Give it a try and I think you will find that you appreciate them more. Not only that, you will find that you are welcome and greatly appreciated too.




