


Pray for Our Troops

The Toy Run

It was not just another traffic control/escort assignment. It was an escort that was of such importance to so many; that we wanted it to be just right. It was the *Annual Lake Loons Toy Run*, and two of its stops were in Brenham. Two lucky Brenham families were adopted this Christmas by these civic minded motorcycle riders. The Lake Loons are made up of many motorcycle clubs and riders from the Lake Somerville and Snook area (even our own Tony Smith from Brenham) that come together for this rewarding endeavor. Hats off to them for their hard work planning, fundraising, researching the families, shopping, making this ride in all kinds of weather and lastly making Holiday Wishes come true for so many. They saved the best for last, as S. Market and E. Alamo Streets were their last two stops this Holiday Season; then the riders headed back home by way of Snook.

The Washington County Citizens on Patrol (WCCOP) and the Brenham Citizens On Patrol (BCOP) were out in full force that Saturday afternoon to ensure a smooth ride thru Washington County and the streets of Brenham for the **120 motorcycles** and various cars, trucks and trailers that were making this ever important trek. The WCCOPs had 3 vehicles and 6 COPs on standby. Two vehicles were stationed at the northernmost Washington County Line, one vehicle took the lead and the second brought up the rear as the group moved thru the County. They also had one vehicle at the Business 36, 36N traffic signal as the group rode into Brenham. That's when the BCOPs took the lead, first blocking traffic at FM 577 and Park Street and then blocking N. Park at Market Street. WCCOPs and BCOPs stayed with the escort thru a few more major intersections like Market at Main and Alamo Streets; with the first leg ending just past E. Tom Green Street at the S. Market Street destination.

All 7 BCOPs staged at the S. Market location along with 2 WCCOPs, and they mingled with the riders and each other. I even caught a glimpse of the family and the children as they were receiving their gifts; the looks on the children's faces was priceless and expressions of gratitude from the adults was also rewarding. The escort was going smoother than anticipated (at least by me) due in part to good planning and communications by City and County COP Units. The other reason it was going so smoothly, despite the many intersections and traffic lights, was the fact that the Lake Loons had several teams of "spotters" that were stationed at most of the intersections. These spotters had traffic vests and traffic control flags that they used to assist us in our efforts. This made our job so much easier; it made a complicated escort relatively simple; considering we had no official Police presence.









Again it was WCCOPs and BCOPs leading the way, with Lake Loon spotters to assist us. It was quite a sight; a sea of motorcycles as far as the eye could see. It was a great experience; just ask anyone that was there. Maybe, we as an organization can adopt a family next year? I know that the CPAAA can't use its funds because of tax reasons, but the BPD and or the COPs might possibly want to take on this labor of love next Christmas (you can count me in).
