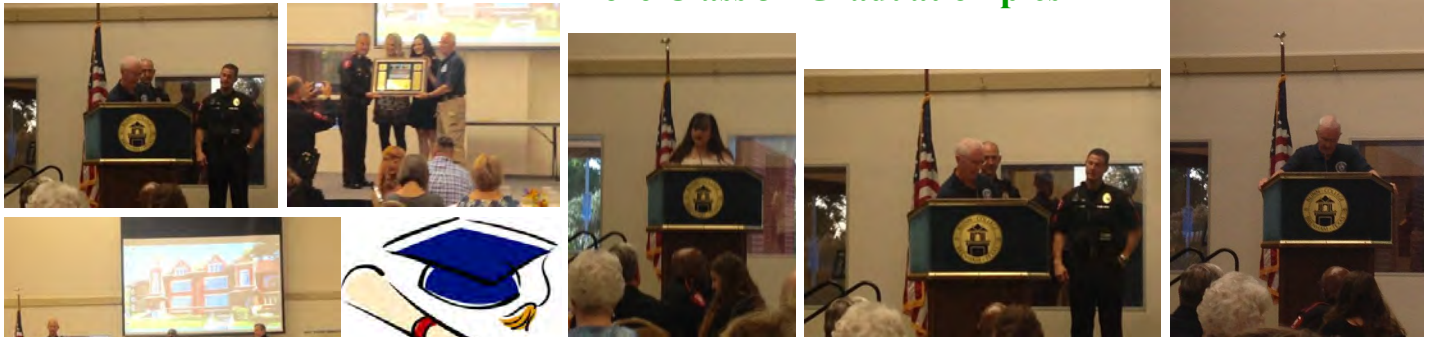

Volunteer Spotlight



Bob Cothorn joined our organization in 2008 responding to an article in the paper announcing the Brenham Police Department was “looking for a few good men”. After nine years of service to the Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association (CPAAA) along with the Citizens On Patrol (COP) organization and the Brenham Police Department, he’s never looked back; having enjoyed many service opportunities over the years. He has served as CPAAA President and currently holds the position of Treasurer. As a COP Sgt., he is responsible for the upkeep of our COP vehicles; he oversees the school traffic team, and compiles the monthly hourly reports of our volunteers. Quite a laundry of duties; but Bob is always up for the task. Bob is a Lieutenant’s Gold Whistle Award winner and former COP of the Year recipient.



Bob spent most of his formative years growing up in Albuquerque, NM. He received a BBA degree from the University of New Mexico and upon graduation, promptly married his High School sweetheart, Sharon. One month later, Uncle Sam came calling; and Bob answered the draft call to serve in the Army. Duty wasn’t all that bad though; after garnering a top secret clearance, he spent most of his time at the Army Air Defense Command Headquarters/NORAD in Colorado Springs, CO. After receiving his honorable discharge, he and Sharon set about raising their two sons and pursuing a career in business. Bob went to work with a large home furnishings company rising to a regional vice president after 19 years. Seeking a change, he soon transitioned into the banking world. It was this change that ultimately brought him to Brenham in 1995.

As a VP with Bank of America, he was transferred to Houston to help with the start-up of the Texas operations. Not wanting to live in Houston, he and Sharon discovered Brenham; so he happily opted for a commuters’ life in order to enjoy the advantages of a small town. After some time, an opportunity came along to accept a VP position with the NY Investment Banking firm of Lehman Brothers. Little did he know, five years later, this large 150 year-old company would be at the tipping point for the 2008 financial crisis and recession. Lehman declared bankruptcy and Bob reluctantly declared “retirement”! He and Sharon recently celebrated 47 years of marriage. Together with their two sons and two beautiful daughter-in-laws, have a combined 5 grandchildren. Like many of us, they look back and wonder where the time went!!

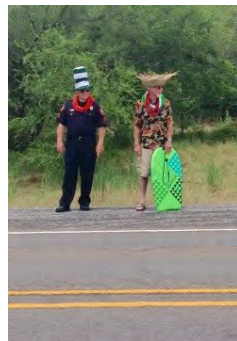
Ron Wise & Rob Aguilar handled the finger printing!

What flavor was that cake, Luke? It has blue icing!

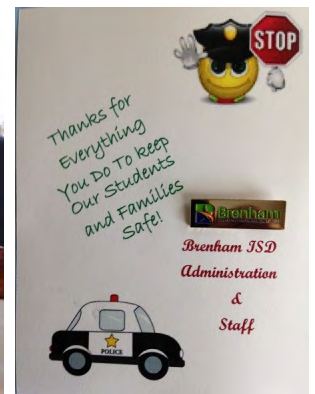


Far Left: Jaws of Life demo was underway.
