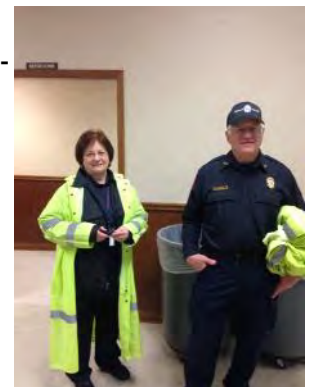

Committees and You

The following is a list of the CPAAA Committees, Committee Chairperson, and what that committee does. This list is for clarification; as some may not know how certain committees function. A better understanding of these committees may lead to more participation by you, the members.

Media/Newsletter Committee - Rob Aguilar This committee is charged with public relations for our organization. It places notices, pictures and pleas in the local newspaper. It is charged with putting out our monthly newsletter, the Informant. Rob is always looking for news worthy items to place in the Informant; and for anyone willing to sit down and write articles, as well as submit pictures for publication.

Speaker Committee - Laura Sparks This committee is charged with obtaining a suitable speaker for our meetings on a quarterly basis. They will also provide the Media committee with a brief biography of the speaker so it can be published in the local paper prior to meeting night. They will also introduce the speaker to our group on meeting night.

Social Committee - Patricia Badough The social committee puts our social functions together. They secure a proper venue for the type of function we wish to have. They secure a caterer if needed, and music if desired (Band or DJ). They are also tasked with set up, which may include purchasing table cloths, silverware, etc. and making sure the venue is ready for guests. They will also have to make sure the venue is cleaned after use. They will also have to make sure that deposits and bills are paid for all items related to the event. Even the Christmas Parade Float falls under the social committee's purview.

Fundraising Committee - Clarence Steinfeld The fundraising committee is in charge of our two major fundraisers: the Bake Sale (held the Saturday before Mother's Day) and the Drive Thru Fundraiser (held the first Monday in November). They are tasked with everything related to these fund raising efforts like having tickets printed, printing posters and signs and displaying them. Also, getting volunteers to help and or to bake items. They also have to secure the venues and make sure no rules are being violated as related to the venue. Lastly, they are in charge of the monies collected until which time as the Treasurer takes possession.

Benevolence Committee - Annette Tiemann This committee is charged with keeping the membership informed on the wellbeing of its members. They will report on major illnesses or pending surgeries. They will also send out Get Well cards to members that are ill or infirmed, Condolence cards to members that have lost loved ones. On a brighter note, we will also send out Cards for promotions, and other milestones; as well as Thank You cards to individuals or businesses that have treated us or the department well; or to those that have donated time or money to our causes.

Membership Committee - Carole Petzolt This committee is charged with recruiting new members from the current CPA Class. Seeing that the enrollment forms are filled out properly and that dues are paid. Contacting members if dues are delinquent. And, answering questions about membership and our organization.

On Wednesday, March 7th, Police Officers, Firefighters, relatives and friends gathered at Memorial Oaks Chapel to pay their respects and bid a final farewell to the “Mother of the Brenham Police Station” Debbie Northrup. She was called the “mother of the station” by several officers that would seek her counsel from time to time; she was quite wise and would tell it to you straight. She would also help officers solve other, less personal problems, regarding department forms and procedures. She would be the go to for COPs wanting to order uniforms, name tags, etc. for the first time. You would see Debbie substituting for any of the ladies, upstairs and down; she knew all of their jobs.

She was an accomplished horsewoman, who loved nature and the outdoors. She and her husband, Preston, rode with the Salt Grass Trail Ride Association for over 25 years. Her friends would say that Debbie never saw a horse that she couldn’t ride. They would also say that Debbie never met a stranger; she would treat everyone like family. Debbie also cared for Preston, who was partially paralyzed following a horse-related accident.



Debbie was a woman of faith, and was a fixture at the Cowboy Church of Brenham. Even, the week before her death she was there worshipping God at the Cowboy Church. Such devotion to family and God has most assuredly earned her a place in heaven. She lost her long battle with cancer; and is now in the hands of the Lord. Another friend said, “She was just an old-fashioned cowgirl with a heart of gold.” BPD’s Facebook page said “Debbie was by far the toughest woman we had ever met, and will be missed greatly here at the PD.”
