Volunteer Spotlight



He was born in Coshocton, Ohio. Coshocton is a Lenape Indian word which basically means where there is a river crossing; later altered to mean ferry or river-crossing device. Coshocton, in East Central Ohio, is “the Made in the USA City” and home to the largest American Flag Manufacturer. It is the birthplace for the Specialty Advertising Industry. Latex gloves, March of Dimes, and others including our own Ron Wise. Ron grew up nearby, on a farm in Frazeytsburg. His upbringing would give him his love of plants, trees, animals and birds; and the rich native Indian cultures of the area would also influence his love of Indian artifacts, art and jewelry.

Ron graduated from Frazeytsburg High School and would enroll at Ohio State University, but did not get to attend. He was drafted into the Army and would serve out his 2-year commitment, and an extra 4 months due to the Berlin Crisis, in service to his country. After his stint in the Army he would get his Associates Degree at Franklin University in Columbus, Ohio. He later received the prestigious FLMI Designation (Fellow, Life Management Institute), which would help him in his long Insurance career.

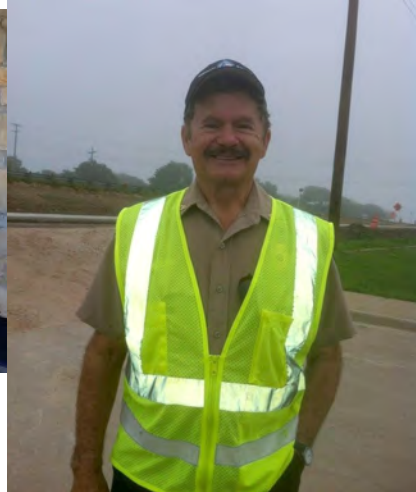
Ron met his bride, Barbara, at a dance in Frazeytsburg. She made quite an impression by spilling a coke all over them while they were doing a cake walk. With a promising career in Life Insurance, a beautiful bride; the next logical step would be to start a family. Being the logical person that he is, Ron did just that. He and Barbara would be blessed with a daughter, Monique; then later a son named Derek. Ron always dreamed of moving to a warmer climate; he thought, perhaps Florida. But, being the logical person that he is, Texas was a better fit. He and his growing family would move to Austin, Texas; where they stayed about 8 years. Ron then accepted a position at Germania Insurance Company here in Brenham. That was some 30 years ago, and now, luckily for us, Brenham is still his home.

Actually, Ron lives just outside of Brenham in the Burton area, in close proximity to the Latium Fire Department; where he has been a volunteer auxiliary member for quite some time. Giving back to the community is in Ron’s nature; that’s why he joined our Citizens On Patrol group after attending our Citizens Police Academy Class 24, back in 2010. Ron has been very helpful over the years with CPAAA and COP projects. I think his favorite COP activity is helping with Child Identification Kits; he was great at fingerprinting and putting the children at ease about the process.

As mentioned, Ron loved plants, trees, animal, birds and Indian art and artifacts; all of which are on display at his home. He had pheasants, peacocks, turkeys, geese, rolling pigeons, etc. in his aviary. He had sheep and goats and dogs. However, Ron has been under-the-weather for a while; accepted into hospice care and could not care for his flock or garden. His friends have taken his animals and birds and Barbara tends to his garden and their dog. Ron and Barbara recently celebrated 60 years of marriage, quite an accomplishment in this day and age; and from what I can see, it was quite a lovely journey.

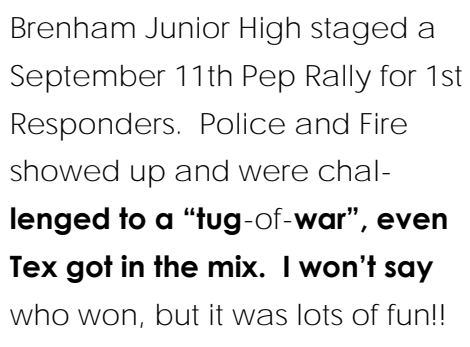

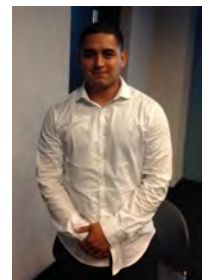

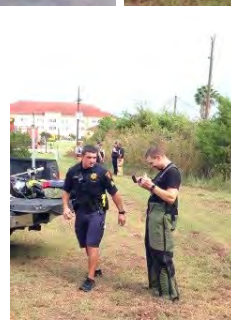


2 photos to left: Sgt. Todd Ashorn is the COP Liaison Officer again, our group listens to him intently at our last meeting.

Here at BPD, we work together all of the time; whether it's with EMS, or the Fire Department, or DPS, or The Sheriffs Office, electric department, or whom ever. But on September 26th, not only did we work together, we worked with quite a few different entities. It was a covert call (didn't go out over the radio air waves) for a possible pipe bomb. Not having a bomb squad here in Brenham, led to calling the College Station Police Department for mutual aid, via the Brazos Valley Council of Governments (COG) mutual aid agreement. We can call the COG for things like the Bomb Squad, Haz-Mat Team, etc.; and they can call us for help, as well. We had BPD, BPD Canine Unit, DPS, EMS, Fire Department, and SO stopped by as did a COP and we had the College Station Bomb Squad on scene. It was just a small incident, but safety demands a certain SOP in these situations. While I worked closely with the Bomb Squad in San Antonio, while on their Haz-Mat Team; the equipment today is a bit more updated and the call was interesting. The bomb suit and helmet are state of the art and that aluminum looking thing (back of the pick up in the photo below) is a water cannon (it also shoots shells). For safety, we were quite a ways back so I didn't get to see the operation (very wooded area). See the photos of this incident below.

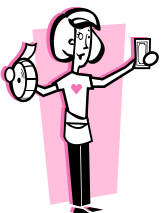
