

Traelan Amar Nickerson was only 15 years old when he passed away, but he touched many lives in that short period of time. He was introduced into the BPD family by ,then Officer Lance Weiss who met Traelan while volunteering for Adam's Angels. He was in the Adam's Angels program because of his terminal brain cancer; but you would not have known he was in pain because he was **always smiling**, always had a positive attitude. In 2014, Traelan was bestowed the title of Honorary Police Chief of the Brenham Police Department. Traelan took his position as Chief very seriously; and he was soon a fixture here at BPD. I was fortunate to have gotten to know him and spend some time with him. No one knew him better than Lance, who spent a lot of time with him and his family (mainly his grandmother and caregiver Marilyn Contee). I can remember playing football with him one Christmas Eve; he was wearing the Dallas Cowboys gloves that Chris Jackson had given him, even though, he was a die-hard Texans fan. He was diagnosed at the age of 6 and was not expected to reach 10 years old. He defied the odds and hung around long enough to make a big impact on those around him. He was good student, despite the fact he was constantly in pain and suffered from seizures quite often. He also had friends in the Fire Department (he lived a block from the Fire Station) and EMS, as well. He will be missed; he was truly an ANGEL. And remember, "God got this"!!


