

Note: Unless necessary for officer safety, officers and communications specialist are to utilize "plain English" when communicating on our radio system. Signals and other 10 codes are still utilized for data entry and where officer safety is a concern.

The approved 10 – codes are listed below:

10-4: Acknowledgement

10-6: Busy unless urgent (lunch, etc.)

10-33: Emergency situation

10-94 : Secure radio

10-96: possible mentally ill person

10-99: wanted or stolen

It's Hip to Microchip

Microchipping your pet is one of the best ways to ensure a speedy reunion with your animal if it strays. Owners assume a dog collar and tags will ensure a safe return, when a family pet wanders. However, collars and tags are easily lost or removed. As soon as an animal is surrendered to the Animal Shelter, it is scanned for a microchip. Without a way to identify lost pets, they wind up in the Animal Shelter, looking for a new home. Don't let this happen to your pet. Protecting your pet only takes a few minutes.

The Brenham Animal Shelter will offer \$10 microchipping whenever it is open. A recent study proved that microchipped cats were 20 times more likely to be returned to their owners than those not microchipped. Microchipped dogs made it home 2.5 times more often than those without the chip.

When microchipped, the Brenham Animal Shelter automatically registers your pet with the nationwide registry. It is important to keep your contact information up-to-date; be sure to provide multiple emergency contacts in case your pet strays while you are out-of-town. Your pets don't even realize when the chip placed under their skin. The chips are no larger than a grain of rice. Unlike collars and ID tags, they can never break or fall off. They work by receiving a radio signal from a scanner and and transmitting the encoded chip ID number back to the scanner. With the chip ID number in hand, the contact information is only a phone call away. If there is a question of ownership, the chip is definitive proof of who owns the pet.

Below are photos at the Puppy Dawgs and Cat Tails location that the Brenham Pet Adoption Center (Animal Shelter) held a \$10 Microchipping and a \$40 Adoption Fee Special on Saturday, May 18th. Jerry Jares worked at 1804 Longwood Drive, Animal Shelter location and Richard Jares worked the Puppy Dawgs and Cat Tails location in downtown Brenham. 20 pets were brought to the Animal Shelter for microchipping and 8 pets found their forever homes during that adoption sale. Richard had the camera at his location; sorry Jerry!!
