

Our newest weapon in the fight to keep Washington County (Brenham) residents safe. This is our recently launched Multi-Mission H-145 Helicopter. The H-145 is a twin engine light utility helicopter made by Eurocopter and Kawasaki Heavy Industries. This model has more power, a greater payload and more interior space than its predecessor; and can be configured in many ways dependent upon its use. It officially went on-line this Monday, May 4th and has already been used a dozen times. It is capable of providing medical transport, search and rescue operations, hoist rescue capabilities for water and cliff rescue operations, firefighting capabilities and of course for some law enforcement operations as well. However, BPD has not worked out its SOPs or SOGs with the EMS Department yet. This is a joint partnership with Washington County EMS and REACH Air Medical Services. REACH will provide the Multi-Mission Helicopter and (more on Page 2)

complete flight service support, including aircraft operating costs, pilots, mechanics, and hanger and crew quarters; all at no cost to residents. It is currently housed at the Brenham Municipal Airport. Should the aircraft need routine, scheduled or unscheduled maintenance the contract guarantees the County usage of an equivalent back-up helicopter. REACH will reimburse the County for all employee salaries, program direction, administrative oversight and crew quarters. We are now just one of two such programs in the state; with only a few like this in the nation. *I feel safer already!!*

## National Police Week



In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15<sup>th</sup> as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as National Police Week. Thus, this year National Police Week is celebrated May 10th thru the 16th. Every year on May 13<sup>th</sup> the Annual Candlelight Vigil at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington D C is held, whether or Mational Police Week not it falls during National Police Week. However, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, National Law En-

forcement Officers Memorial Fund, CEO Marcia

Ferranto stated "we will not let this crisis deter us from honoring the fallen. We plan to march forward in solidarity with a virtual Candlelight Vigil and the reading of the names can be watched from anywhere in the world..." Fallen Law Enforcement Officers will be honored during a virtual Candlelight Vigil that will be livestreamed on May 13th at 7 pm central time at NLEOMF.org/UBL or YouTube@TheNLEOMF.

The Memorial Service began in 1982 as a gathering in Senate Park of approximately 120 survivors and supporters of law enforcement. Decades later, the event, more commonly known as National Police Week, has grown to a series of events which attracts thousands of survivors and law enforcement officers to our Nation's Capital each year. National Police Week usually draws in between 25,000 to 40,000 attendees. The attendees come from departments throughout the United States as well as from agencies throughout the world. However, this year all events have been cancelled; but the National Fraternal Order of Police and the Memorial Committee reported that they are working to have a "meaningful and respectful media tribute to our fallen heroes on May 15th, National Peace Officers' Memorial Day." This year, 307 names are being engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington, DC, adding to the nearly 22,000 killed in the line of duty already memorialized there. 






# A Bad Situation












Always remember the pandemic that crippled our nation; but we triumphed by making the best of a bad situation!










### Pandemic Blues By Rob Aguilar


