Powell said that the situation would have taken a turn for the worse had it not been for Martinez' intervention.

Officer Martinez thanked everyone for the recognition, along with thanking his fellow officers and partner on his shift for helping

give him the courage to do what he did. Mayor Milton Tate said he was proud of Martinez, adding, he is glad Martinez is on the Brenham police force. Police Chief Ron Parker said, with public service, the opportunity exists to make a positive difference in people's lives; and Martinez showed that with his actions. He said that this is something that "will be remembered for eternity". City Manager James Fisher said Martinez is an example of "the caliber of people" the city has in its Police Department. He said the ugly side of society has shown itself over the last couple of weeks, often hiding the good things that police officers do. Further, he thanked the Brenham Police Department and its officers for their service and for "making a difference in this community".

Richelle married her longtime sweetheart, Harris County Sheriff's Deputy retired, (after 30 years of service) James Malinowski. Richelle and James were married on June 19th; at a small country wedding at James' mother's acreage and home on the Brazos River. 




8-11-52 - 6-22-20

A friend of BPD and the Brenham Community passed away on Monday, June 22, 2020. Billy Ray "Bill" Winkelmann. Billy Ray was born on August 11, 1952 in Brenham, Texas and was a 1970 Graduate of Brenham High School. He attended Commonwealth College of Science and graduated in 1972. he was a licensed funeral director and embalmer at Brenham Memorial Chapel. Bill served his country in the Army, Army Reserves, the National Guard and the Coast Guard Auxiliary. He was a member of the Elks Lodge, JC's and CCA. Bill married his best friend Karen Vesper on December 7, 1996. Together they raised a blended family with 4 children. Bill was employed by Blue Bell Creameries as the Warehouse and Distribution Coordinator from 1976 to 2020. He was active in the community and served the Brenham Fire Department from 1979 to 2010; moving up to be the First Assistant Chief; he was named Firefighter of the Year in 1985 and 2009. 




