Alan E. Finke Memorial Service













Alan Eugene Finke was born on November 19, 1953 in Navasota, Texas. Alan was a husband, father, grandfather and devoted public servant to the city of Brenham. He passed away into the the Lord's loving embrace surrounded by his family, on Sunday, November 8, 2020. Alan met his soulmate and future wife, Debbie, at the tender age of 11. Their legacy of love began and they grew up together. Alan and Debbie were married on May 24th 1975. They would have go on to have three daughters, Amanda, Rachel, and Katy. The Finke household was one of music, laughter, and lots of love.

He first served the Brenham community as a *police officer with BPD*. In 1978 he found his true calling and was hired as a paid firefighter with BFD. Alan pursued a career path within the Fire Department. He would move through the ranks, eventually becoming the Deputy Chief/Fire Marshal. He would also continue to keep up his peace officer certification which he would need when becoming an Arson Investigator in 1990; and earned the title of Certified Fire Investigator in 2006. Alan went on to serve as President of the International Association of Fire Investigators from 2008-2010. In December of 2015 Alan retired from the Brenham Fire Department, having served our community for 40 years.

After retirement, Alan and Debbie moved to College Station where he spent his remaining years playing music, riding his motorcycles, meeting friends for weekly breakfasts, and doting on his three grandchildren. Alan loved a good joke, a good fire, a good story, a good song, and a good motorcycle. I will miss all of those jokes and stories he would tell around the firehouse; and the council and wisdom that he would freely share. He will be missed!

so make the most of that time and fill it with mirth!!








New Board Members Elected


