



National Police Week



In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15th as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as National Police Week. Thus, this year National Police Week is celebrated May 9th thru the 15th. Every year on May 13th the Annual Candlelight Vigil at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington D C is held, whether or Mational Police Week not it falls during National Police Week. However, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, CEO Marcia

Ferranto stated "we will not let this crisis deter us from honoring the fallen. We plan to march forward in solidarity with a virtual Candlelight Vigil and the reading of the names can be watched from anywhere in the world..." Fallen Law Enforcement Officers will be honored during a virtual Candlelight Vigil that will be livestreamed on May 13th at 7 pm central time at NLEOMF.org/UBL or YouTube@TheNLEOMF.

The Memorial Service began in 1982 as a gathering in Senate Park of approximately 120 survivors and supporters of law enforcement. Decades later, the event, more commonly known as National Police Week, has grown to a series of events which attracts thousands of survivors and law enforcement officers to our Nation's Capital each year. National Police Week usually draws in between 25,000 to 40,000 attendees. The attendees come from departments throughout the United States as well as from agencies throughout the world. However, this year all events have been cancelled; but the National Fraternal Order of Police and the Memorial Committee reported that they are working to have a "meaningful and respectful media tribute to our fallen heroes on May 15th, National Peace Officers' Memorial Day." In 2021, 394 names are being engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington, DC, bringing the total to 22,611 officers killed in the line of duty. Of those 394 names, 295 are from 2020 and 99 are from 2019; further, 182 are Covid-19 related deaths. For more info log onto www.NationalPoliceWeek.com

In person events are planned for October 13-17 in Washington, D.C.to offer the same respect, honor, remembrance, and community support as National Police Week, while allowing law enforcement, survivors, and citizens to gather and pay tribute to those who gave their lives in the line of duty. In Brenham, the Washington County Peace Officers Assoc. is holding a Memorial Service on Friday, May15th at the Courthouse at 10 am.

It was decided that we would present the CPAAA and COP 2020 Certificates and Awards at or April General Meeting. On April 12th we did just that! Our CPAAA Member of the Year, COP Member of the Year and The Officer's Choice Award winner were all announced. Past President, *Annette Tiemann* was presented a plaque for her work as President in 2020. All of our COP members with over 36 hours were presented their Certificates and Vouchers. We learned that *Sherry Parker-Steinfeld* was our CPAAA Member of the Year, while *Doug Feist* was our COP of the Year, and BPD Officers chose *Stan Ford* to receive their Award. While it wasn't our usual "Holiday Party/Awards Banquet", we did get to celebrate a bit with Pizza, which was donated by Pizzaiolo's, and home made cakes brought by some members. Just another reminder of the weird and difficult year we all just went through. Perhaps the 2021 Awards ceremony will be back to normal!










A Bad Situation

It will all be over soon, that is the hope of our nation;


still making the best of a bad situation.

but we triumphed by making the best of a bad situation!






