"Working Together" is a common heading that is highlighted in almost every Informant publication, since I have been its editor. Working together is one of the most important aspects of public safety; whether it be law enforcement, firefighting, emergency medicine or public works. Brenham public safety entities have a long record of working well together; which includes county and state agencies. There is continued proof in the pages of this publication. Take, for instance, the incident Friday morning, October 22nd at Hwy 290 access road at Chappell Hill Street. Washington County E-911 toned it out as a typical General Alarm vehicle fire; and after receiving more calls, they let responding fire units know it was a heavy equipment grader (also called a bull dozer and earth reclaimer by some) fully involved in flames. The first unit on scene asked for a second alarm assignment for additional manpower and water tanker vehicles from nearby Salem Fire Department. An 1 ³/₄" line was laid to fight the blaze and it was quickly apparent that this was a gas fed fire. The grader had ruptured an underground gas line. An additional alarm for manpower and water tankers went out to Chappell Hill and Meyersville departments. While the gas department is notified of all General Alarm fires; BFD advised dispatch the need to expedite the gas department's response. This triggered the law enforcement response because of traffic and related safety concerns. Interim Fire Chief Roger Williams arrived on scene and assumed command of the incident. I arrived seconds later and was assigned as the Operation's Chief. An additional line was laid as the power lines were being threatened; Blue Bonnet Electric was asked to expedite their response, as well. The gas department realized that this was a 6" gas line, they used the shut-off valve on the west side of the incident, but needed a special tool to shut it off from the east side. The special tool was at their shop on Austin Street. I got a command vehicle and drove Gas Department Director, Ande Bostain, Code 3, to his shop. We loaded the equipment and re-turned to the scene. Ande's gas department crew was still digging, but the hydraulic tool was now on site for use. In my absence, 2 three inch lines were laid into a master stream device. We discovered that a yard hydrant in the new complex was on-line so we hooked up a Meyerville unit and put another master stream device from the opposite direction onto the fire. The object was not to extinguish the fire, but to just keep it cool; extinguishment would come after the gas is completely shut off. By that time, our interim City Manager, Carolyn Miller and HR Director Susan Nienstedt had been on scene to see if there was anything that we needed and to observe the incident. Ms. Miller talked with the Fire Chief, the Police Chief and others. I had a chance to speak with her also, and the conversation was one of praise for the responders on the scene. She was astonished at how well everyone was working together. The theme of working together kept coming up in our conversation. It should be noted that when she was made aware that the tool used to shut-off the 6" gas line was the only one that the city had and if the west side shutoff valve had failed the line couldn't be shut down; her response was, they should add another one to the budget. Now, that was a great response; something that a good city manager would say. The gas line was shut off and the fire was extinguished. All is right with the world again, or at least in Brenham. I would like to thank everyone at the scene that morning, working hand in hand to get the job done. The Brenham, Salem, Chappell Hill and Meyersville Fire Departments, the Brenham Police Department: Chief Ron Parker, WC Sheriff's Office: Chief Deputy Jay Petrash, DPS Troopers Duke and Reaves, and COP's Dorothy Antkowiak, Annette Tiemann, Frank Nowak and Tex Davis. Thank you to Blue Bonnet Electric Department and Ande Bostain and his gas department crew. Interim Fire Chief Roger Williams said "he is very proud and appreciative of the efforts of all units on scene", adding "today was a great example of how departments can work together to achieve a common goal." He said, the outcome could have been significantly different were it not for all that responded in mitigating the incident. The City Manager thanked everyone that she came into contact with. It was great to see her and her directors at our scene, along with Ms Miller and Ms Nienstedt, General Manager over Public Utilities Debbie Gaffey and Alton Sommerfield also made location; showing that they support our efforts. 
