The "WRAP" Device

Officers have undergone training for use and deployment of the "Wrap", a device designed to safely restrain violent suspects who are resisting arrest and/or transport by police. The device has been proven to be effective in lessening the chances of injury or death to suspects, and to police officers, and is employed in such a manner that there is little risk of restrictions of a person's airway/breathing or suffering from head injuries. Officers also had to have the device employed on them in order to satisfy training and certification requirements. Several of the restraints have been purchased and received and have been issued to each patrol shift.


