






Ríchelle's Day

The following is a list of the CPAAA Committees, Committee Chairperson, and what that committee does. This list is for clarification; as some may not know how certain committees function. A better understanding of these committees may lead to more participation by you, the members.

Media/Newsletter Committee - Rob Aguilar This committee is charged with public relations for our organization. It places notices, pictures and pleas in the local newspaper. It is charged with putting out our monthly newsletter, the Informant. Rob is always looking for news worthy items to place in the Informant; and for anyone willing to sit down and write articles, as well as submit pictures for publication.

Speaker Committee - **Kay Reichwein** This committee is charged with obtaining a suitable speaker for our meetings on a quarterly basis. They will also provide the Media committee with a brief biography of the speaker so it can be published in the local paper prior to meeting night. They will also introduce the speaker to our group on meeting night.

Social Committee - **Patricia Badough and Debbie Parker** The social committee puts our social functions together. They secure a proper venue for the type of function we wish to have. They secure a caterer if needed, and music if desired (Band or DJ). They are also tasked with set up, which may include purchasing table cloths, silverware, etc. and making sure the venue is ready for guests. They will also have to make sure the venue is cleaned after use. They will also have to make sure that deposits and bills are paid for all items related to the event. Even the Christmas Parade Float falls under the social committee's purview.

Fundraising Committee - Annette Tiemann and Juanita Gockel The fundraising committee is in charge of our two major fundraisers: the Bake Sale (held the Saturday before Mother's Day) and the Drive Thru Fundraiser (held the first Monday in November). They are tasked with everything related to these fund raising efforts like having tickets printed, printing posters and signs and displaying them. Also, getting volunteers to help and or to bake items. They also have to secure the venues and make sure no rules are being violated as related to the venue. Lastly, they are in charge of the monies collected until which time as the Treasurer takes possession.

Benevolence Committee - Annette Tiemann This committee is charged with keeping the membership informed on the wellbeing of its members. They will report on major illnesses or pending surgeries. They will also send out Get Well cards to members that are ill or infirmed, Condolence cards to members that have lost loved ones. Membership Committee - Sherry Parker-Steinfeld and Dorothy Antkowiak This committee is charged with recruiting new members from the current CPA Class. Seeing that the enrollment forms are filled out properly and that dues are paid. Contacting members if dues are delinquent. And, answering questions about membership and our organization.

Voucher Committee - Annette Tiemann and Rob Aguilar This committee will help with determining what can be purchased with your voucher. In an effort to take some of the burden off of the Treasurer we will help with your reimbursements and even with ordering uniform items.

Sierra found out that Sarah loves llamas, anything pink, soccer and anything police-related; so with help from several police officers she purchased various items and even had some made. Sierra's plea to fellow officers was on February 23rd and by March 4th she had everything ready to go. She and Cpl. Andrea Guerra made the trek to Victoria to surprise Sarah with a whole host of things including: a uniform shirt with patches, collar brass, name tag and BPD Tie Tac, a BPD cap, a BPD challenge coin, police flag, BPD lanyard, a llama themed hooded blanket, balloons, and the list goes on. 
