



Bringing Awareness

Bringing awareness to something that is important to you is a gratifying thing to do. Bringing awareness to something that is beneficial to your fellow man, and something that can save thousands of lives is an extraordinary thing to do. Well, extraordinary was the theme of the day for the Lone Star Circle of Life (LSCL) Bike Tour; that made a stop right here in Brenham on May 11th; during their week-long tour of Texas. The LSCL Bike Tour was bringing awareness to the importance of life saving donations, like donating blood, being in the bone marrow registry and being an organ donor. Ten dedicated riders made the trek to Brenham after their stop in Huntsville, which is about seventy-five miles away. I might add that it was a hot and humid day in May; but the riders came in with big smiles on their faces and quite a few great stories and testimonials to tell. The riders were escorted to Fireman's Park by BPD's own Sgt. Todd Ashorn with a little help from onduty officers. While the riders each rode for a specific aspect of life saving donations; they also rode to honor someone in our community and or surrounding areas. I was humbled that I was chosen to be honored by rider Guy Hoffman II, a DPS Trooper out of Austin/Round Rock. I was nominated by Kelly Hardin of the Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center. Guy was riding for me, but also to raise awareness for organ donation through the Donate Life Texas Registry and how to register via the Department of Motor Vehicles (when you renew your driver's license). The other nine members of the team were: Team Captain Tim Dixon a "Donation Advocate" out of Trinity; Jennifer Alpard a "Living Kidney Donor" out of Houston; Gabe Canal a "Donation Advocate" out of Tyler; Joe Canal "Parent of a Recipient and Donor" out of Tyler; Seth Cooke a "Donation Advocate" out of Tyler; Rodney Ford a "Living Kidney Donor" from Brandon, Florida; Sarah Pipkin-Love a "Heart Transplant Recipient" from Corpus Christi; Chance Sebek "Parent of a Recipient" from Belton; and Matt Shane a "Kidney Recipient" from Hewitt. Of course, the team has a Support Team to watch out for their welfare, map their routes, photograph them, pace them and fix their bikes when necessary. The Support Team members included: Keith Steward a "Kidney Transplant Recipient" from Gatesville; Debbie Fendrick a "Donation Advocate" from Temple; Melanie Hartman a "Kidney Transplant Recipient" from Happy, Texas; Michael Johnson the team mechanic from Huntsville; Holly McCoy a "Donation Advocate" from Pflugerville; and Debbie Mabry a "Donation Advocate" from Temple. This extraordinary group of individuals was an inspiration to the small group gathered at Fireman's Park. Their stories and testimonials were quite heartwarming and brought many a tear to my eyes. I agreed with all that was said that day and am proud to say that I practice what they were preaching, in that, I donate blood regularly, I am in the Bone Marrow Registry (though I believe that I have aged out of that program), and I checked the box at the DMV to be an organ donor. The news media was there that day to listen and to disseminate; I hope that their message was heeded by everyone that read their articles and or heard the news stories; because bringing awareness to such an important and simple life saving idea like donation is a worthwhile endeavor.








10-99 : Wanted or Stolen
