Paint

Paint, paint thinners, solvents, wood preservatives, turpentine and varnishes, deck stains



Household

Fluorescent bulbs, grease, cooking oil, ammunition



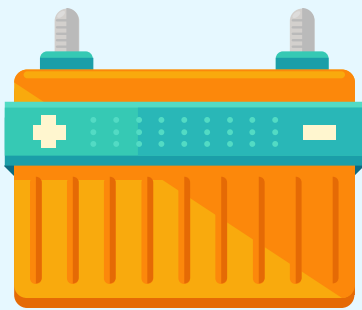
Cleaners

Household cleaners, rodent poison, pesticides



Aerosol Cans

Spray paints, air fresheners, oven cleaners



Lithium and Other Batteries

Batteries contain toxic elements, including lead, mercury, cadmium, and lithium which can explode under pressure and high heat.



Medical Waste

Medication, catheters, needles, human waste



Gasoline

Diesel, gasoline, and fuel oil are not accepted due to being highly flammable.



Vehicle Items

Tires, transmission fluid, brake fluid, oil filters, antifreeze, grease, motor oil
