The Residential Needs Assessment is well underway. Our consultant, Steven Spillette with Community Development Strategies (CDS) has held several meetings in our community already including:

- Wende Ragonis Anderson, Washington County Chamber of Commerce
- Stephanie Doland, City of Brenham Development Services
- Jennifer Eckermann and Kathrine Briscoe, Main Street Brenham
- Dane Rau and Crystal Locke, City of Brenham Parks & Recreation, Public Works

- Members of the South Central Board of Realtors (SCBOR)

In addition, Steve was able to attend the June EDF Board Meeting to brief business leaders about the study and let them know that he would be setting up interviews in the coming weeks. The next phase of meetings (in-person, virtual, or by phone) will be with the top area employers.

A survey intended for completion by employees throughout the community is nearing final approval and will be deployed starting next week. In addition to having the survey shared by the employers following Steve's meeting with each of them, the survey will also be available online and pushed out by our media partners and social media. The media push began with a Press Release dated June 30, 2021 (attached).

Data collection should be completed by the end of July allowing for the month of August for CDS to tabulate the data and write the report. We anticipate the completed Residential Needs Assessment by early September.

# Residents Spoke and City of Brenham Listened Residential Housing Needs Assessment Underway This Summer

The City of Brenham has engaged Community Development Strategies (CDS), a Houston-based company specializing in professional market and economic research, to perform a residential needs assessment. The project is funded by Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC). When the City of Brenham adopted the Comprehensive Plan on September 19, 2019, one item listed by community members as a concern of future growth was inadequate housing. The Comprehensive Plan is a long-range planning document identifying and prioritizing the City's needs and goals for the next twenty years. The plan examines the needs of the community holistically to ensure that land uses are supported by infrastructure and facilities.

Susan Cates, Director of Economic Development for the City of Brenham stated, "Major employers in our community have told us that finding and retaining quality workers is hindered by lack of appropriate housing stock." She continued, "We are conducting this assessment as a first step to reversing that so our companies can compete for top-notch employees in the region." A residential needs assessment has never been done for the city.

CDS brings a level of experience with seasoned professionals that is critical for the success of this project. One aspect of their study will be interviewing major employers to determine the impact inadequate housing has on the future growth of their business. Employees of local businesses will be asked to complete a confidential online survey designed to determine where employees live, would they choose to live closer to work if it was an option, and type of housing they are seeking. Employees will have the chance to win a Yeti cooler by completing the survey.

#### 4. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon FY2020-21 First Quarter Financial Statements

Assistant City Manager – Chief Financial Officer Carolyn Miller presented this item to the Board. Miller explained the following details about the financial statements:

#### Sales Tax Revenue

• FY21 sales tax revenue is trending above budget. FY21 sales tax is \$28,410 ahead of budget and \$20,189 above prior year.

#### Financial Statements – Fund 250

- *Economic Development* operations have an operating surplus of \$65,299 as of the end of the first quarter. All operating expenditures are within budget levels and comparable to prior year.
- **Recreation** operations have three (3) of the eighteen (18) approved parks and recreation projects completed as of the first quarter. All other projects are on schedule to be completed in FY21. Recreation operations ended the quarter with an operating surplus of \$205,905.

#### BCDC Capital Projects – Fund 252

• No activity occurred in the BCDC Capital Projects Fund for the first quarter of FY21. Fund balance is \$915,841 is available for future project expenditures, and we expect to begin utilizing the fund balance along with the \$750,000 Texas Parks and Wildlife Grant for the Southside Family Park as the park project gets underway in FY21.

# 5. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon Funding a Residential Needs Assessment for the City of Brenham and Authorize the Chairman to Execute Any Necessary Documentation

Economic Development Director Susan Cates presented this item. Cates explained that in the BCDC FY21 budget, \$25,000 was allocated for planning. It was hoped that BCDC could leverage these funds with grant money from the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) to do both a corridor study of Market Street and a residential needs assessment. However, due to changes underway at the TDA regarding the grant parameters, the grant is not available at this time.

Cates advised that the topic of residential needs in Brenham appears to be the most necessary at this time. Cates explained that the conversation regarding the need for low-income housing, affordable housing, and workforce housing is being hotly debated as potential developers are requesting this type of information as part of their due diligence on our community.

Cates advised the Board that she received three quotes for the assessment:

- Zonda Advisory, \$25,500 plus expenses
- Community Development Strategies, \$23,250 plus expenses
- RCLCO Real Estate Advisors, \$50,000 plus expenses

Director of Development Services Stephanie Doland stated that she is in support of the study and agrees with Cates that it will be very helpful for staff to have this information in working with developers. Doland also explained that it would help her staff in planning for future development and community needs.

After much discussion by the Board a motion was made by Ken Miller and seconded by Jim Kolkhorst to approve the funding of a residential assessment for the City of Brenham, to be performed by Community Development Strategies in the amount of \$25,000 and authorize the Chairman to execute any necessary documentation.

Assistant City Manager – Chief Financial Officer Carolyn Miller presented this item to the Board. Miller explained the following details about the financial statements:

#### Sales Tax Revenue

• FY21 sales tax revenue is trending above budget. FY21 sales tax is \$43,678 ahead of budget and \$40,332 above prior year.

#### Financial Statements – Fund 250

- *Economic Development* operations have an operating surplus of \$55,278 as of the end of the second quarter. All operating expenditures are within budget levels and comparable to prior year.
- *Recreation* operations have eight (8) of the eighteen (18) approved parks and recreation projects completed as of the second quarter. All other projects are on schedule to be completed in FY21. Recreation operations ended the quarter with an operating surplus of \$259,384.

#### BCDC Capital Projects – Fund 252

• During the second quarter of FY21, \$10,589 was spent for the archaeological study at the Brenham Family Park. The balance of \$1,062,282 remains in the fund with \$51,000 allocated for the Highway 290 feeder traffic signal work and the remaining \$1,011,282 for Brenham Family Park capital projects.

# 4. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon the Reallocation of FY2020-21 Parks and Recreation Funds for Various Parks and Recreation Projects

Director of Public Works Dane Rau presented this item. Rau explained that during the 2020-21 funding meeting the Board approved 9 projects related to park improvements totaling \$742,500. Rau explained that there were approximately \$100,000 of savings from two of the projects: Fireman's Park Outfield Wall Replacement and Phase II of the Splashpad at Henderson Park.

Rau advised the Board that he would like to reallocate the \$100,000 savings for two projects that have come up the past couple of months:

- Maintenance at the Brenham Pickleball Complex: This scope of work involves
  repairing the old joints and resealing to protect pickleball players from safety issues.
  These courts change dramatically after the hard freeze and now have significant
  openings at the old joints and increased surface cracking. The cost of these
  improvements is \$20,000.
- Environmental Assessment of Phase I(a) of the Brenham Family Park: This assessment is mandated by the National Parks Service prior to releasing the \$750,000 Texas Parks and Wildlife Grant. The Woodman Group provided a quote to perform this assessment at a cost of \$50,000.

A motion was made by Ken Miller and seconded by Jim Kolkhorst to approve the reallocation of \$100,000.00 in parks and recreation FY2020-21 budget savings to cover maintenance to the Brenham Pickleball Court and the environmental assessment for the Brenham Family Park.

# 5. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon the Brenham Community Development Corporation's Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-22:

Assistant City Manager – Chief Financial Officer Carolyn Miller presented an overview of the FY2021-22 budget requests. Miller provided the following highlights of each department request:

- Economic Development Budget Summary
  - Sales tax revenue increased approximately 10% from FY21 to FY22 in anticipation of a recovery in collections after the COVID pandemic.
  - An interlocal agreement between the City and Washington County was approved creating the Brenham Washington County Development Organization (BWEDO). For FY21, the County is contributing \$75,000 to Economic Development activities and will contribute \$100,000 annually for FY22 and forward.
  - No material change to on-going expenditures such as debt service, operations, marketing, and Business Park maintenance.
  - Interfund loan repayment (3 of 10) to Recreation side for funds borrowed to construct the detention ponds in FY20.
  - o Total budget request totals \$687,921, leaving a contingency balance of \$102,785.

#### Recreation Budget Summary

- Sales tax revenue increased approximately 10% from FY21 to FY22 in anticipation of a recovery in collections after the COVID pandemic.
- o Tier 1 funding requests from Aquatics, Parks and Recreation total \$1,152,741 leaving a contingency balance of \$107,276.
- o Tier II funding requests from Aquatics and Parks total \$676,568 and are not being recommended for funding at this time.

Director of Economic Development Susan Cates presented the line-item budget for economic development:

#### **B.** Main Street

- Incubator Program Support.....\$15,000
  - This is for incremental lease support for incubator tenants and programming for training that will be open to the public.

2. Discussion, Presentation and Update by Jones Carter Engineering on the Proposed Brenham Family Park Phase I(a) Design

Community Services Specialist Crystal Locke opened the meeting with an overview of the Brenham Family Park, Phase I(a) design project. Locke explained that in August 2020 the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission approved the grant request for the Brenham Family Park project for \$750,000. The required match comes from the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) and the City of Brenham. Locke advised that the total project cost for Brenham Family Park Phase I(a) is \$1.7 million and the proposed development includes a 10-feet wide concrete pedestrian and bike-friendly trail, restrooms, pedestrian bridge, security lighting, native landscaping, picnic facilities, a parking lot, road expansion, lake development, and park signage.

Locke explained that the City contracted with Jones-Carter for planning, surveying, and civil engineering services in early February and in March began bi-weekly meetings to discuss park design, grant information, land updates, and project schedules. Locke stated that representatives from Jones-Carter will present the 30% plan design of the Brenham Family Park Phase I(a) and answer any questions about the development of the park.
