Phase I (a) Design

On August 27, 2020, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission approved the grant request for the Brenham Family Park project for \$750,000. The required match comes from the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) and the City of Brenham.

The total project cost for Brenham Family Park Phase I(a) is \$1.7 million. Proposed developments include a 10-feet wide concrete pedestrian and bike-friendly trail, restrooms, pedestrian bridge, security lighting, native landscaping, picnic facilities, a parking lot, road expansion, lake development, and park signage.

Staff contracted with Jones-Carter for planning, surveying, and civil engineering services in early February and began bi-weekly meetings every other week, mid-March, to discuss park design, grant information, land updates, and project schedules.

At the recent Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) meeting in May, staff secured additional funds of \$265,000 towards the project above the grant amount to assist with costs for Phase I(a). Staff is also working with the City Secretary's Office to author a City Naming Policy. The purpose of this policy is to develop a systematic and consistent approach for the official naming of public facilities in the City that is fair and ensures a worthy and enduring legacy for the City. In addition, the City may seek sponsorship for the naming rights as a method of obtaining funds to aid in their construction, maintenance, and operation.

The Jones-Carter team will present the 30% Design of the Brenham Family Park Phase I(a) and answer questions about this development at the meeting. The agenda for the meeting presentation is on the next page—the tentative project timeline is on page 3.

  - Currently coordinating with city staff and the landscape sub-consultant to finalize exact pond boundary
- Completed 30% civil plan design of the detention/ amenity ponds
- Preliminary cost estimates and comparison to TPWD grant funding

### **Next Steps**

- Once the pond footprints are finalized, JC will submit the H&H model and report to the City of Brenham for review in mid-June
- JC will continue working towards construction documents and detailed grading and specifications for a July submittal
- Finalize preliminary cost estimates to identify Phase 1 landscape design features, including the restroom, pavilion, trail signage, and the playground
