Subject: Discussion Regarding Rates and Operational Changes for Blue Bell Aquatic

Center for Calendar Year 2024

Date: October 25. 2023

The Blue Bell Aquatic Center was tasked to evaluate the current budget, operating hours, and programs and compare operations to similar facilities. If possible, to present ways to increase revenue and/or lower daily operation costs.

Staff dug deeply through research and site visits to similar facilities, finding not many with the amazing amenities the City of Brenham has to offer.

Below are some findings and recommendations for consideration of the Blue Bell Aquatic Center.

1. On October 18<sup>th</sup>, staff presented a Resident / Non-Resident Daily Admission Fee Schedule for the Blue Bell Aquatic Center to the Parks and Recreation Board. Resident Fees would slightly increase \$1, with \$5 being a year-around rate instead of just during the summer months. In addition, we looked at implementing a Non-Resident daily admission fee. The board understood the split and settled on an \$8 daily admission fee for non-city residents. Children under 3 will go to \$3 city resident and \$5 non-city resident. By implementing a resident/non-resident fee this will allow city residents to pay less than non-city residents due to them already paying taxes that support many operations of the Aquatic Center. With this change and when it is carried across the board on almost all rates associated with the Aquatic Center it will help narrow the gap on expenses and revenues. Projected additional revenue is estimated at \$82,643 for next budget year with new rate adjustments.

- 2. Staff proposed a slight increase or change to the Carousel fee changing from \$1/rider per day to \$1/ride.
  - It is hard to tell what this budget impact would be but for the 2023 Season we had 5217 riders that had unlimited rides the days they were there.
- 3. Staff is recommending that we purchase pool blankets for the Therapy Pool. The City of Conroe uses blankets for their outdoor heated pools to keep the heat in as well as preventing as much evaporation. Staff would like to invest in blankets to try in the therapy pool. This would allow us to determine how much savings we would have in electrical, water, and chemicals. If this proves to be substantial, we can consider blankets for the competition pool as well.
  - a. It is hard to tell exactly what this budget impact would be, but we should see savings in electrical, water and chemicals.
  - b. The cost of a Pool Blanket for Therapy Pool would be \$20,000.

4. Staff are recommending that we charge for Floats-N-Flicks movie nights at the BBAC. Normally this event is free to the public, as the event license and equipment is funded by BCDC, but the event does require that we have staff and Lifeguards onsite to work, that cost is not included in the funding. Recommendation from staff is the regular entrance fee or pool pass.

- 5. Finally, Staff has been asked to consider closing one day per week and what that might look like. Currently the Blue Bell Aquatic Center is open at the peak of the season (June-August) 7 days a week. In the Fall/Spring we are open 6 days a week. Staff have looked at all programming, schedules, staffing, etc. and are recommending the following.
  - a. Year Round Closing on Mondays
  - b. Peak Season being open Tuesday Sunday (Memorial Day Labor Day)
  - c. Off Season being open Tuesday Saturday (Labor Day Memorial Day)
    - i. This would affect aerobic schedules, swim team schedules, programming for camps, etc.

If all these items were put in motion it could result in an estimated \$82,643 in new revenue and savings of about \$38,000. New rates will be taken to City Council in November for final approval, and we will keep working with Parks Board on adjustments to operations at the Blue Bell Aquatic Center.

Currently expenditures for the Blue Aquatic Center are \$1.1 Million and revenues are \$315,000. By making these changes it could have an impact of \$120,000 narrowing that gap when comparing revenues and expenditures.

Currently Strand Associates is 95% complete with the design of the sewer main extension and lift station at the Brenham Business Center. Bidding was anticipated for October 17 but has been postponed to January 2024. Strand Associates suggested holding off on bidding the project out due to a bid opening that they recently held for a lift station project in a neighboring community. In this bid opening they only received one bid, and the cost received was substantially higher than the expected cost. Strand reached out to other contractors to see why they did not bid, and they stated that their workload was too heavy at the time and would not be looking to bid more projects till after the new year. Due to these reasons City staff felt like Strands recommendation was the best approach for moving forward with the project.

One item The City of Brenham and Strand Associates have been working through is the electrical service for the lift station. The City of Brenham Public Utilities Department along with Strand Associates have been in conversation with Bluebonnet Electrical Cooperative regarding the electrical service line that is to serve the Brenham Business Center lift station. Bluebonnet has proposed two options, please see each option below:

- Option Number 1 Tie into Bluebonnet's switchgear that is located at the intersection of Blue Bell and James Nutt Blvd. To get the primary cable to the lift station it will require a bore under the low water crossing that is located to the Southwest of the intersection. Bluebonnet will also have to upsize the existing switchgear that they will be tying into. While Bluebonnet has not given an exact price, they are expecting the quote to be around \$200K.
- Option Number 2 Create a temporary overhead service line that would extend from the far Southwestern property line to the lift station. This temporary overhead service would be approximately 700 ft in length. Being that it will be placed on the Southwest side of the low water crossing it will not be noticeable from the Blue Bell Road or James Nutt Blvd. Please see Exhibit A for the proposed route. While Bluebonnet has not given us an exact

cost for this option, they have stated that it would be a much cheaper option and should be around the 20K to 40k range.

The City of Brenham Public Utilities Department has met and discussed both options and feels that Option Number 2 is the best option at this time.


Listed below are the concerns that we have for Option Number 1:

- Without knowing the potential electrical loads that could come to the developments that would be located on the Southwest side of the low water crossing, there is a chance that the electrical that would be installed could be too small and would have to be upgraded again causing more financial cost.
- Without having a design for the low water crossing improvements, there is a possibility that the electrical lines could become in conflict with future low water crossing design causing the electrical line to have to be relocated. This could lead to challenges for keeping the lift station in service during construction of the low water crossing.

The City of Brenham Public Utilities Department requests that BCDC approves Option Number 2. allowing a temporary overhead power line to serve the proposed lift station. After the final electrical design is completed the Public Utilities, Department will come back before BCDC to inform them of the exact cost of the service and receive approval for all financial costs associated with the electrical service.






