5. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon the FY2023-24 Fourth Quarter Financials

Director of Finance – Stacy Hardy presented this item to the Board. Hardy explained the following details about the FY2024-24 fourth quarter financial statements:

Sales Tax Revenue

• Actual sales tax revenue for FY24 ended the year favorably at \$2,513,801 which is \$33,801 or 1.4% ahead of budget and \$77,993 or 3.2% above the prior year.

<u>Financial Statements – Fund 250</u>

- Economic Development: Currently reports a deficit of \$449,126 for FY24 due to the land repurchases from Brenham Kitchens and Capital Westview Partners. Incentive payments were made to Chick-fil-A and Academy and matching contributions for Main Street Incentive Grants were made to two downtown businesses. Also, in FY24, work continued on the James Nutt Blvd. sewer extension in the Brenham Business Center. To date, BCDC has paid \$353,566 of engineering and construction costs with the remaining costs of \$611,255 to be incurred in FY25. Ending fund balance reserves for the Economic Development side are \$1,583,000.
- Recreation: Ended the year with an operating surplus of \$219,655. Thirteen (13) parks and recreation projects were funded in FY24. Of these projects, 11 were completed by the end of the fiscal year. Work on the therapy pool restrooms and Phase I of Jackson Street Park improvements were in progress at year-end and will be completed in FY25. Fund balance reserves for the Recreation side ended the year at \$1,239,407.

BCDC Capital Projects – Fund 252

➤ In FY24, engineering work continued for the Brenham Family Park. Year to date, \$82,048 has been paid to Quiddity Engineering for Phase I(a) park improvements. A fund balance of \$719,409 remains for Brenham Family Park project expenditures. The \$750,000 Texas Parks and Wildlife Grant is not yet reflected in this financial statement because the funds have not yet been received.

Re: Discussion and Update Regarding Request for Proposals to Jackson Street Park

Phase 1 Improvements

On February 4, 2025, the City of Brenham along with Burditt Architectural opened requests for proposals regarding the Jackson Street Park Phase 1 Improvements. The scope of work consisted of bringing the entire park up to ADA specifications, enhancement of one restroom facility, adding a new playscape and swing set, upgrading all electrical throughout the park (walking trail, field lighting, and low-level lighting under the trees and sidewalk extensions). It also includes an additional 4 courts for pickleball.

Within the last two years BCDC has allocated \$1,215,000 toward Phase I. With engineering costs, geotechnical reports, and paying for the playground/swing set, we are left with \$898,650 for the rest of the amenities that we wish to add and upgrade.

We had a total of 8 companies send proposals for the work, in which all proposals were very competitive, but all were over the \$1M mark. The lowest proposal was from DL Meachum at \$1,145,690 plus an alternate bid of \$35,270 for the shade covers for the new pickleball courts. Other base bids ranged from \$1.17M, \$1.205M, \$1.26M, \$1.35M and upwards. Looking at just the base bid, we are about \$247,000 short of allocated funds.

To get this project underway, we would like to ask BCDC to consider allocating additional funds of \$247,000 using fund balance reserves. There is an opportunity to award the proposal and then work with the chosen company to value engineer some elements out. With this option we would not move forward with the alternate, which is shade canopies over the bleacher area of the new pickleball court. If we would like to add that feature, we would need \$282,000 from fund balance. According to the attached FY25 Budget Projection, the Recreation side of BCDC is projected to end the year with \$1,162,237 in fund balance reserves.

We are so close to starting another improvement to a staple park in our community and I know you all will be proud once this project is underway and complete. We appreciate your support and understanding as we work on this project.
