4. Presentation and Discussion Relating to the ADA Access in the City of Brenham Parks

Public Works Director Dane Rau presented this item. Rau explained that earlier this year a group of local park users attended a Parks Board meeting to discuss ADA accessibility within the Brenham park system. Since that meeting, staff researched the ADA requirements for city parks and made some upgrades to the parks. When the parks were built in 1999 - 2000, the ADA requirements that were in effect at that time were met. Staff invited the group that attended that meeting back to attend this Parks Board meeting.

Rau shared some of the new projects and upgrades:

- Improvements to the surface area at Hohlt Park restrooms
- Field 4 and Kenjura Field had new bleachers installed with ADA accessible landings and access
- Skate Park pathway access
- Michael Mansfield Owsley Playground and Serenity Garden pathways

Rau stated that staff will continue to look at designated pathway access to the park fields. Rau explained that the ADA requirements for parks state that if there is stadium seating at the sport fields, then there must be a designated flat pathway. If there is no designated seating, there is no requirement for having a designated pathway. However, Rau explained that staff will continue to look at ways to make the park fields accessible to all park users.

5. Presentation and Discussion Relating to 2017 Recreation Events

Community Services Director Wende Ragonis presented this item. Ragonis explained that Staff seeks direction and guidance from the Parks Board regarding 2017 special events, specifically the two large community events – the Christmas Stroll and Lighted Parade and the Easter Egg Hunt. Ragonis explained that staff is considering not doing the Easter Egg Hunt.

Community Services Specialist Crystal Locke explained that there are several large Easter Egg Hunts put on by various organizations that are open to the public. Locke stated that staff's purpose is to provide events for citizens that may otherwise not be offered.

The Board members agreed that the City of Brenham does not need to hold the Easter Egg Hunt this year. Ragonis stated that this will allow staff to focus on other opportunities for the City.

Ragonis asked for feedback from the Board about the Christmas Stroll and Lighted Parade. Ragonis explained that due to the weather the parade was cancelled; however the other activities went as planned. Although the weather caused the parade to be cancelled, the Board thought that two days for the Christmas Stroll and Lighted Parade was a viable option.

6. Discussion Relating to the 2017 Meeting Dates

Vice Chair Bill Betts noted the dates proposed by staff.

At the February 8, 2017 Parks Board Meeting, staff will present an update on the newly modernized and renovated library facility and the programs that are now offered through the Nancy Carol Roberts Memorial Library (NCRML). With the renovation of this facility and the addition of the new park amenities at Fireman's Park, the Library is uniquely position to offer programming that will enhance the surrounding park area and the park amenities now impact the daily operations of the NCRML as well.
