1. Call Meeting to Order

Parks and Recreation Advisory Board Liaison Crystal Locke called the meeting to order.

2. Citizens/Visitor Comments

Citizen Linda Thomas stated that this year marked 20 years of advocating for a handicap parking lot at the Blue Bell Aquatic Center and noted that City Management indicated this project would be addressed this year. Thomas asked the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board to support the handicap parking lot at the Blue Bell Aquatic Center.

Public Works Director Dane Rau added that staff received renderings for the modified Phase II of the Blue Bell Aquatic Center, identifying the handicap parking lot.

3. Introduction of New Board Members

Community Services Specialist Crystal Locke introduced and welcomed the two new Parks and Recreation Advisory Board members, Dr. Tina Henderson, and Dusty Robinson.

WORK SESSION

5. Presentation and Discussion Related to Brenham Pickleball League

Citizen JC Robinson presented this item. Robinson, Vice President of the Brenham Pickleball League, discussed the Leagues past, present, and future with the Board. Robinson explained how the Club plans to grow the League through community involvement, such as offering youth summer camps, junior development camps, introduction classes, Family Day pickleball experiences, and tournaments. Robinson elaborated on tournaments and explained the types of pickleball tournaments and the benefits, such as tourism, hotel stays, and weekend activity. Robinson further explained that to host tournaments, more pickleball courts are needed. Robinson added that time is of the essence.

Board Member Ginger Bosse questioned dual-use and asked whether the High School tennis courts could be used. Robinson explained the difficulties of hosting an event at multiple venues.

Board Member Paula Buls asked about the cost to build pickleball courts. Robinson replied that his research suggests \$30,000-\$60,000 per court. Robinson noted the League recommends 20-25 pickleball courts along with stadium courts. Rau added that Robinson and Boeer previously presented the information to staff, and a pickleball complex is in the 7-year Capital Improvement Plan for Parks and Recreation.

6. Discussion and Update Related to the Brenham Family Park Design and Construction

Public Works Director Dane Rau opened the discussion. Rau explained that since the last Board meeting, the Land Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) application for the Brenham Family Park was prepared and sent to the National Park Service for pre-application review in late December. Rau noted that an Archeological Survey was required through the Texas Historical Commission (THC) and added that the City contracted SWCA Environmental Consultants in early December. A draft report was submitted to THC on January 5, 2021. Rau informed the Board that the Council approved the planning, surveying, and civil engineering services contract from Jones | Carter at the February 4, 2021 meeting. Rau added that staff will begin meeting regularly with Jones | Carter to discuss the park's layout and design elements. Rau noted the grant agreement execution is planned for April 2021, and staff is hopeful to begin construction in August 2021.

7. Discussion and Update on Parks and Recreation Projects Funded in FY20-21

Public Works Director Dane Rau presented this item. Rau explained to the Board that the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) approved \$1,019,500 for various park and recreation projects and updated the Board on each project's status.
