Recreational Trails Program for Crossover Nature Trail

The initial grant agreement for the Recreational Trails Program (RTP) was expected in April/May 2021. Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) staff reported experiencing some delays and anticipating a few additional months before the grant agreement phase. The review process involves the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) Environmental workgroup staff and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). TPWD does expect an update from TxDOT soon for the environmental and archeological clearance status. Once the review is complete and clearance is given, TPWD Recreational Trails Program staff can obligate federal funding to our project with FHWA.

No work that is to be counted as a match or submitted for reimbursement can occur before receiving and signing the Local Grant Agreement as there are no pre-agreement activities or costs allowed by FHWA.

The Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) approved \$10,000 during the FY21 funding cycle for the conceptual/engineering design for the Blue Bell Aquatic Center (BBAC) Modified Phase II. Staff contracted with Progressive Commercial Aquatics and received renderings on several different options as we move forward with possible phases in the future.

We are concentrating on a parking lot that will allow Therapy Pool patrons along with handicap users the ability to access that area more efficiently. We feel that this is our top priority and with these improvements come facility upgrades. We will have to ensure that building access is allowed and remains safe for all since a secondary access point will be granted with the additional parking lot and entry. With this our top priority, we concentrate on those two things that we feel can be accomplished in or around the \$250,000 mark. After this is completed, we have asked Progressive to look at an open-air concept and decking additions to our competition pool area. With this comes many challenges, and before we dive fully into this, we will need more time to consider HVAC changes, bleacher relocations, and overall operations. We do have this targeted for 2022-23. We have also asked Progressive to design a master plan for Phase II to show an additional outdoor competition/training pool, decking additions, and a teen leisure pool area. It will also include fencing and amenity additions such as furniture and miscellaneous items associated with outdoor pools. These phases are in the early preliminary stages. They are only being considered and evaluated by Progressive and staff as funding is not being allocated this year for amenities outside of the additional parking lot. We are still getting final renderings and estimates for each phase.

Renderings of the different phases and amenities will be presented at the meeting.

Public Works Director Dane Rau added that staff received renderings for the modified Phase II of the Blue Bell Aquatic Center, identifying the handicap parking lot.

WORK SESSION

5. Presentation and Discussion Related to Brenham Pickleball League

Citizen Kathy Boeer, President of the Brenham Pickleball League, introduced herself. Citizen JC Robinson presented this item. Robinson, Vice President of the Brenham Pickleball League, discussed the Leagues past, present, and future with the Board. Robinson explained how the Club plans to grow the League through community involvement, such as offering youth summer camps, junior development camps, introduction classes, Family Day pickleball experiences, and tournaments. Robinson elaborated on tournaments and explained the types of pickleball tournaments and the benefits, such as tourism, hotel stays, and weekend activity. Robinson further explained that to host tournaments, more pickleball courts are needed. Robinson added that time is of the essence.

Board Member Ginger Bosse questioned dual-use and asked whether the High School tennis courts could be used. Robinson explained the difficulties of hosting an event at multiple venues.

Board Member Paula Buls asked about the cost to build pickleball courts. Robinson replied that his research suggests \$30,000-\$60,000 per court. Robinson noted the League recommends 20-25 pickleball courts along with stadium courts. Rau added that Robinson and Boeer previously presented the information to staff, and a pickleball complex is in the 7-year Capital Improvement Plan for Parks and Recreation.

6. Discussion and Update Related to the Brenham Family Park Design and Construction

Public Works Director Dane Rau opened the discussion. Rau explained that since the last Board meeting, the Land Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) application for the Brenham Family Park was prepared and sent to the National Park Service for pre-application review in late December. Rau noted that an Archeological Survey was required through the Texas Historical Commission (THC) and added that the City contracted SWCA Environmental Consultants in early December. A draft report was submitted to THC on January 5, 2021. Rau informed the Board that the Council approved the planning, surveying, and civil engineering services contract from Jones | Carter at the February 4, 2021 meeting. Rau added that staff will begin meeting regularly with Jones | Carter to discuss the park's layout and design elements. Rau noted the grant agreement execution is planned for April 2021, and staff is hopeful to begin construction in August 2021.

Public Works Director Dane Rau presented this item. Rau explained to the Board that the Brenham Community Development Corporation (BCDC) approved \$1,019,500 for various park and recreation projects and updated the Board on each project's status.


