4. Presentation and Discussion of Various 2021 Sports Tournaments Held in the City of Brenham Parks

Parks Superintendent Casey Redman presented this item. Redman presented the Sports Tourism spreadsheet, which listed tournament dates and the number of participating teams.

6. Discuss and Possibly Act Upon the Recommended Changes to the 2022 Parks and Recreation Fee Schedule

Blue Bell Aquatic Center – Outdoor Leisure Pool Private Rentals. Remove the \$50 charge to bring your food and increase the Leisure Pool rental from \$300 to \$350.

7. Parks and Recreation Staff Updates

- ➤ Blue Bell Aquatic Center Assistant Aquatic Superintendent Kelsey Toy reported statistics for the Blue Bell Aquatic Center, staffing, maintenance, programs, and usage.
- ➤ Citizen Linda Thomas spoke about the Blue Bell Aquatic Center hours of operation. Thomas noted that even though the pool does not open until 6:00 am, the lifeguards arrive at 5:30 am and sometimes allow pool users in 10 minutes early. Thomas said this is very beneficial to user schedules and requested that the pool could open consistently at 5:50 am.
