1. Call Meeting to Order

2. Citizen/Visitor Comments

WORK SESSION

3. Discussion and Update of the City of Brenham Comprehensive Plan for Parks and Recreation

Recreation Specialist Crystal Locke presented this item. Locke stated that staff wanted to update the Board on various Parks and Recreation projects underway, yet to be completed, or completed from the Comprehensive Plan 2040.

Locke covered the following goals and identified completed projects since the adoption of the plan in September 2019:

- A continued provision of high-quality park space and recreational programming to meet the needs of residents and visitors
- An emphasis on Brenham's natural, historical, recreational, and cultural assets in marketing and economic development efforts
- A renewed focus on pedestrian and bicyclist access and safety within the City, including connecting to park and recreational sites via trails, sidewalks, and onstreet bicycle facilities.

4. Discussion and Update to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) Local Park Grant Program for the Brenham Family Park Phase I(a) and Recreational Trails Grant Program for the Nature Trail at Hohlt Park

Recreation Specialist Crystal Locke presented this item. Locke stated that TPWD submitted the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) application for Brenham Family Park to the National Park Service (NPS) on December 17. Locke explained that TPWD notified staff on April 18 of two essential items regarding the Environmental Assessment (EA) that needed to be addressed: (1) EA feedback from NPS and (2) USACE consultation and clearance. Locke said that City staff met with Quiddity, formerly Jones-Carter, Wild Associates, TPWD, and the NPS to address the EA comments and that the team would update the EA to reflect those changes and resubmit. Locke referenced the timeline and added that Quiddity had submitted the 80-90% civil plans for the Brenham Family Park for internal review by staff.

Locke reported that the City had received the Notice to Proceed (NTP) with construction for the Crossover Nature Trail at Hohlt Park. Locke said that staff coordinated with Alan King with Landscape Architecture to organize efforts moving forward. Director of Public Works Dane Rau added that King was finalizing the design based on feedback from TPWD, preparing the bid documents, and starting the bidding process.

5. Discussion and Update on Parks and Recreation Projects Funded in FY21-22

Director of Public Works Dane Rau presented this item. Rau updated the Board about various park and recreation projects and each project's status.
