1. Call Meeting to Order

2. Public Comments

WORK SESSION

4. Introduction of New Visit Brenham Team Member Elayne Grisbee

Kathrine Briscoe Tourism & Marketing Manager presented this item. She introduced Elayne Grisbee, and she started on March 5, 2024, before Spring Break. Elayne is a recent graduate of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro where is majored in Economics. We are excited to have her as the newest member of the Visit Brenham team.

5. Update on Hosting of Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street Exhibition

Jennifer Eckermann, Tourism & Marketing Director presented this item. Work on the local exhibits is progressing and our plans with community partners are evolving as we proceed. We are looking at having sound walks around the communities, a volunteer committee chair is being developed, along with a meeting about Camptown tonight at 6 pm. We are working on updating the Washington County Historical Markers Guide and thanks in part to the support of the Washington County Commissioner's Court, developing brochures and rack cards to promote all the activities. We have a marketing plan that is also being developed, fundraising plans, and a timeline and calendar for all projects.

6. Report on Visit Brenham Application for Recognition as an Inaugural Texas Tourism Friendly Community

Jennifer Eckermann, Tourism & Marketing Director presented this item. Travel Texas which is a part of the Office of the Governor's Economic Development and Tourism division. This division is responsible for promoting Texas as a premier travel destination. Visit Brenham submitted a Letter of Intent to apply to become one of the inaugural certified communities, and submitted general information in the first section of the application which was approved. She and Kathrine Briscoe met with Travel Texas concerning the next steps of the application process.

7. Report on Formation of STR Group and Plans for Upcoming Meeting

Jennifer Eckermann, Tourism & Marketing Director presented this item. During a meeting with TH&LA President and CEO Scott Joslove, he encouraged the formation of a STR property owner group that would set up regular meetings and agendas for those meetings. He assigned several owners in attendance to a committee to plan these meetings which will be held bi-monthly and with topics for these. Visit Brenham sent an email from the property owner list and twenty owners came to the meeting. Their first meeting was on Wednesday, April 17, 2024, at the Washington County EMS building where Commissioner Hanath presented about County HOT funds.

8. Report on New Tourism Grant Application Being Developed

Commission Kirk Hanath presented this item. The County Tourism Grant Funding committee has updated the Tourism Grant Application by simplifying the application process. It will go before the Commissioners Court on Tuesday, April 23, 2024. The County Attorney's office has reviewed it as well. The next round of funding will begin on May 6, 2024, online.

9. Visit Brenham DMO Fiscal Year Q2 Report

Jennifer Eckermann presented this item, along with Kathrine Briscoe, Partners & Visitor Experience Manager; Alex Dill, Manager of The Barnhill Center; Melinda Faubion, and Natalie Lange. Kathrine Briscoe reported on the DMO and Visitor Center statistics, Spring Break Experiences, Visit Brenham website and wildflower watch page and statistics, E-Newsletter, and "What's Happening this Week." Natalie Lange gave her report on social media's popular posts for communities, Facebook, and Instagram. There will be an Influencer coming next week to Brenham. Melinda Faubion reported on digital marketing with Madden Media, and we are doing a great job per Madden Media. She also talked about our print and digital ads, and bonus media/advertorials. Alex Dill gave her report about The Barnhill on group rentals, the entertainment, the upcoming 2024 Speaker Series Luncheons, and the 100th Anniversary Kick-Off Celebration with the unveiling of the "100 Years of the Simon" Exhibit.

10. Washington County Expo Report

Harrison Williams, Director of the Washington County Expo presented this item. He gave an overview of what has been happening at The Expo. It's been quiet due to the Stock Shows, and they also hosted the Fortnightly Annual Book Sale. They received their 130-plus pages of the Feasibility Study and are still going through it. It does have some good plans and ideas in it so far. The Commissioners and the Washington County Fair Association will have a meeting on how to proceed. There are a lot of opportunities for The Expo. One recommendation was to expand the old Road and Bridge building during the Washington County Fair. They are busy at The Expo with events, and they are having people stay in hotels and short-term rentals with an occasional group staying in Bryan/College Station.

11. Administrative Report

Jennifer Eckermann presented this report, along with Scott Atwood and Commissioner Kirk Hanath. Jennifer Eckermann reported that TAMF won the Texas Travel Award for best art festival for the small/medium category, we will re-elect a Chair and Vice Chair at the next quarterly meeting, and HOT figures for the City are down for January and February and are waiting to see the figures for March. Hotels are impacted by economic development, and we are lacking quality hotels. We do have two new hotels coming and they are a dual-brand hotel of La Quinta/Hawthorn and Marriott Townplace. She will have a report on this in the next quarterly meeting. Scott Atwood reported that there will be a meeting with TxDOT about the intersection at Highway 290 and Chappell Hill today at 2 pm. TxDOT already has plans to move forward with the project without the knowledge of the Chappell Hill residences. Commissioner Hanath reported that the Grant Eligibility Committee needs two people for this committee. If anyone would like to serve, please let him know before May 20, 2024. On Thursday, April 25 at 5:30 pm, there will be a prayer vigil for those who were injured and lost their life at the DPS office on April 12, 2024.

With no further business, Scott Atwood adjourned the meeting.

LOCAL EXHIBITS:

Work is progressing on the three local exhibits being developed in conjunction with Brenham's hosting of the Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street (MoMS) program.

A Century of Simon Exhibit:

See the attached exhibit description.

Washington County Freedom Colonies Exhibit in Belle's Alley:

- 5 panels are at approximately 90% completion; 1 panel is at around 70%, and the Introductory panel at around 50%
- A scavenger hunt is being developed for use by schools, other groups and individuals

Camptown Soundwalk Experience:

- Research work and oral histories are still in progress but will start to come together as the exhibit in Belle's Alley nears completion.
- Preliminary Soundwalk script is under consideration.

EXPANDED SOUNDWALK EXPERIENCE:

Thanks to James's idea at the last meeting, we are approaching our partner communities about expanding the idea of soundwalks throughout the county.

- Independence has a walking tour with panels, and James, Kathrine and I met with them once we learned of their interest in creating a soundwalk.
- Melinda Faubion found out that Burton used to have a walking tour brochure, and it is being updated, redesigned and plans are to develop a soundwalk that would be available through a QR code printed on the brochure.
- Chappell Hill is now also working on an updated brochure that can be used as the basis to develop a soundwalk.

HISTORICAL MARKERS GUIDE UDPATE:

This project became much more of a commitment than first anticipated, but the guide will be an excellent resource and very user-friendly.

The history of each community is highlighted, along with the markers in each area. We also gave each community the opportunity to include other historical sites important to the community that may not have a marker.
